### ST. THOMAS PASTOR STRONGLY OPPOSES SUNDAY STREET CARS

ST. THOMAS, Aug. 9.—The Sunday street car service was severely criticized by Rev. Dr. Henderson of the Central Methodist Church last night. He deprecated the action of Mayor Brinkman in according to the request of some people in the city without asking the approval of citizens who were just as much interested in a quiet Sabbath as others. Dr. Henderson had called upon the mayor and demanded his authority for a violation of the law, but the mayor acknowledged that he was responsible and would take the consequences. The doctor charged the noise of the cars with disturbing the Sunday silence, and the movement was opposed by many people. The mayor appears, had wired the attorney-general for permission to run the cars on Sunday, and was advised that he would not object, but he could not authorize any departure from the law. The cars had 2,042 passengers, as against 6,432 on Saturday, the big day in St. Thomas.

## M'NEAL CAUSED THE TORTURES OF RHEUMATISM

DEATH OF CHILD, JURY'S OPINION Happily Stopped When He Began To Take "Fruit-a-lives"

Verdict States Four-Year-Old Girl Died by Strangulation.

WITNESSES ARE HEARD

Possible Motive of Revenge Is Claimed by One Who Testifies.

ST. CATHARINES, Aug. 9.—After 50 minutes' deliberation this afternoon a coroner's jury of Thorold returned a verdict to the effect that Margaret Boucock, aged 4, whose decomposed body was found on the route of the Welland Ship Canal last Wednesday, came to her death by strangulation on the afternoon or evening of July 13 last, and expressed the opinion that her death was caused by the hands of David McNeal, in whose company she was seen walking towards the spot where the body was found. Dr. J. T. Vanderburgh, who performed the post-mortem examination in company with Dr. Puhlow, read his report. He explained that the body was very badly decomposed. Examination proved that the dress was intact. Under the dress was a little waist. The bloomers were not attached to it, but were below the child's knees. There was a piece of cotton about five inches wide and about a yard long, tied with a single knot with a second double knot lying directly at the back of the child's neck. The head had been severed from the body, but whether or not by decomposition Dr. Vanderburgh could not say. Several witnesses were called for the crown. Robert Bradley testified that last winter McNeal told him that there was one man that he wanted to get even with, and that one was Reuben Boucock. He said that Boucock was instrumental in having him put out of a Mrs. Clarke's house. George H. Peterson, who acted for McNeal, objected to such evidence being taken.

### ITALIAN DECORATION FOR GUELPH SINGER ARRIVES FROM KING

GUELPH, Aug. 9.—Three very handsome decorations belonging to Guelph's popular tenor, Ed Johnson, are displayed here. One of these was received by Mr. Johnson only recently, and is the cross of Officer of the Order of the Crown of Italy, which was conferred upon the singer by His Majesty King Victor Emanuel of Italy, in recognition of valuable services rendered during the war. The decorations were transmitted to Mr. Johnson by the British foreign office, through Earl Curzon of Kedleston, having been forwarded to him by the Italian ambassador to the British office, inasmuch as Mr. Johnson is a Canadian, and remains, after his long residence in the United States and Italy, a British subject. The other decorations are the Prince of Wales' medal and another Italian decoration received some time ago.

TORONTO, Aug. 9.—Hon. Manning Doherty, minister of agriculture, received information tonight that his brother, Col. Charles E. Doherty, who has been ill at his home in New Westminster for some time past. Hon. Mr. Doherty is arranging his business here, and will go to his brother's bedside within the next few days. Col. Charles E. Doherty has been superintendent of asylums in British Columbia for the past eighteen years.

TORONTO, Aug. 9. (Canadian Press.)—Fair weather has temporarily deserted the touring party of pressmen, who reached here at 5:30 this evening over the highway from Hamilton. These morning the trains were left at Grimsby, and the visitors motored through pouring rain to the country house of W. J. Southam, near Hamilton.
