Wheat—There was more important news and less important trading this morning than for any similar period in months. May sales at opening were 72% to 72 3-8c. The character of the trading in the pit was the most discouraging feature. The commission houses had no outside orders. The prokers had few orders from brokers in the local trade. The pit traders, and scalpers did the business. The outside markets sent no reports of activity or interest. With the most interesting speculative situation in wheat in months, if not in years, the trade was painfully stagnant. Liverpoof was weak and Id lower, due to the pressure in Russian wheat, who is anxious to get wheat out before any possible war troubles. The bears had the heavy Northwest receipts of 777 cars, against 410 inst week and 448 last year. 
