## \*SEED SOWING.-1889.

LATITUDE 35°.

Favorable times for sowing and transplanting in Virginia, West Virginia, North and South Carolina, Georgia, Kentucky, Tennessee, Arkansas, Southern Missouri, Northern Texas, Arizona, Indian Territory, New Mexico, California, and all places in North America at or near Latitude 35° N.

January.—For roots and crops of downward growth, choose the 5th from 9.50 to 11.05 a.m., when  $\P$  is in  $\Re$  rising. For everything else, the same day is good between 12.35 and 2.10 p.m., when  $\P$  is rising. The 10th and 11th for roots, from 9.35 to 10.50 a.m., when  $\P$  is rising in  $\P$ . The same days from 12.10 noon to 1.35 aft. are also excellent for everything except root crops, potatoes, etc. For roots and potatoes, the 15th and 16th, from 9.15 to 10.30 a.m., when  $\Re$  is rising and the  $\P$  below the horizon in  $\Im$ . The same days are also good for roots between 11.40 a.m. and 1.05 p.m.

FEBRUARY.—On the 1st and 2nd, Luna is in  $\mathcal{H}$ , and root crops should be sown from 7.55 to 9.10 a.m. with  $\mathcal{H}$  rising. Other crops from 10.35 a.m. to 11.55 noon, with  $\mathcal{H}$  rising; and 1.50 to 4.00 p.m. with  $\mathcal{H}$  rising. The 6th, 7th and 8th, for roots from 7.30 to 8.40 a.m.,  $\mathcal{H}$  rising; other things the same days from 10.05 to 11.25 a.m. and 1.40 to 3.50 p.m.  $\mathcal{H}$  and  $\mathcal{H}$  rising. For roots and early potatoes, the 11th and 12th from 7.20 to 8.35 a.m.  $\mathcal{H}$  rising, 9.55 to 11.20 a.m.,  $\mathcal{H}$  rising; other things, 1.20 to 3.30 p.m.,  $\mathcal{H}$  rising.

MARCH.—The 2nd is good for roots from 5.00 to 7.15 a.m., (in X rising; for other crops, 8.40 to 10.05 a.m., and 12.00 noon to 2.10 aft. The 5th, 6th and 7th see (in X and are good for roots from 8.25 to 9.50 a.m., and other things from 11.45 a.m. to 1.55 p.m. The 11th and 12th have (in S and are good for roots between 8.10 and 9.35 a.m., and for things requiring top growth from 11.50 a.m. to 2.00 p.m. For roots, the 18th and 19th, from 5.00 to 6.10 a.m., (in with X rising; also 7.35 to 9.00 a.m., (X rising), and for grain, vines etc., when rises between 11.15 a.m. and 1.20 p.m.
