HE ATTACKED ORONHYATEKHA

Delegate A. W. Blouin, of Montreal, Makes Charges That Foresters' Supreme Chief Ranger Used Bad Judgmen in Investments---The Other Side of the Story.

Montreal, Sept. 7—(Special)—At the convention of the Independent Order of Foresters at Joliette, today, a sensation was caused by Delegate A. W. Blouin, of Montreal, who in a carefully prepared statement made an attack on the administration of Dr. Oronhyatekha, claiming that the supreme chief ranger had bad investments with the funds of the order. He reproved him particularly with the investment in the Union Trust and the tax imposed on the members for the orphange at Desoronto.
