BACHE & CO. LETTER NEW YORK, Jan. 26, 1906. Dear Sir,--The market this week has been a mystery. To all outward appearance it has seemed heavy to the point of breaking. There was no new development to explain the uncertainty, but a pronounced selling movement was in progress throughout the entire week with pressure in evidence on the mining group and on Union Pacific. The most plausible explanation of this weakness was that the Western group of operators, so prominent recently in Tennessee Coal & Iron, had liquidated their stocks and taken the short side of the market. Whatever

Whatever the source of selling, stocks were wonderful-ity well taken and the market rallied imme-diately on the removal of selling pressure. It was apparently something similar to the small boy-drawing a stick from the water and looking for the hole. The underlying strength and strong buying power, on reces-sions such as those of this week, were im-pressive. It promises higher prices before this movement is over. The market is still in an unsettled condi-tion, but the underlying factors are uniform-ly in favor of higher prices. Technically the recent recessions have improved the si-tuation by eliminating weak buil accounts and increasing the short interest. Trade conditions are well filustrated by the unfill-ed tonnage on the books of the Steel Cor-poration-over 7,00000 at the Core-ment in many securities and indications seem to point to higher prices this spring.


