O'CONNOR LAYS DISMISSAL TO POLITICAL MOVE

Former Counsel in Customs
Probe Denies He Was
Partizan

OTTAWA, Oct. 5.—In a statement handed out this evening, W. F. O'Connor, K. C., formerly joint counsel with R. L. Calder, K. C., for the Royal Commission investigating the customs department, charges that his dismissal is based on political grounds.

Mr. O'Connor's statement follows: "During the customs enquiry at Halifax I took the stand that in law all decisions of the department of customs releasing Canadian run-runners because they had been seized outside the three-mile limit were wrong, and I contended that any such vessel, with her cargo, was seizable and condemnable, although taken anywhere on the high seas. I so argued to the chief justice and subsequently to the department that Canadian ships were floating islands of Canada, and that any infraction of Canadian law occurring on the deck of a Canadian ship, at sea, occurred in law upon the soil of Canada.

CONNECTED WITH ACT
"I connected up this argument with certain sections of the customs act which would enable arrests, condemnations and convictions.
"The situation to which I referred had been wholly overlooked by all concerned with the parliamentary committee of last session. Chief Justice Lemieux was interested and impressed. He asked me to prepare fully to argue my contention along with other matters of law arising from the hearings before him at a later date to be fixed.

RICH MEN PLAN TO HELP OTHERS TO OWN HOMES

Thirty Million Dollar Foundation Plan Announced in New York

NEW YORK, Oct. 6.—Financing of a \$30,000,000 interstate enterprise to enable the handicapped man of large family to own his own home, anywhere, on little or no down payment, has been practically completed, according to Allen E. Reels in the Dow Service Daily Building Reports.

There will be available for New York City home construction \$5,000,000. Chicago is to have \$5,000,000 for the same purpose. Boston \$2,000,000, Philadelphia \$1,000,000 and the same amount for Baltimore.

In addition, \$16,000,000 is to be spread over Cleveland, Dallas, Detroit, Indianapolis, Los Angeles, New Haven, Portland, Ore., Portland, Me., San Francisco, St. Louis, Seattle and four other cities. New York City, Chicago, Philadelphia, Boston and Baltimore will comprise the first group to get under way. Organization of this second group of fifteen cities will take place as soon as possible.

Under the corporate title of The American Home Foundation, Inc., is a management group of recognized financiers and philanthropists, many of whom are nationally known, all operating for the time being through W. R. Chapin, formerly of the Guaranty Trust Company of this city.

The plan enables a man of good moral and health rating, but financially handicapped because of a large family, to establish himself and dependents in a dwelling costing from \$8,000 to \$12,000, on terms even easier than those on which he can purchase an automobile on time, because under this arrangement there is not the usual prerequisite of making a substantial first payment down. The first month's rent or nothing gives the prospective owner occupancy, and in from four to fifteen years the house belongs to him.

The particular significance of the organization of this foundation to building contractors, material and equipment manufacturers throughout the country, is that it comes into action at a time when an 8 1/2 per cent. decrease, reported by leading financial rating companies, in national construction activity, is beginning to put mill-sliding ideas into the minds of producers of basic construction commodities.

OWNER PROTECTED
The owner-occupant is protected by the trusteeship of the title to the property with a bank or trust company in such a manner that in absolutely no way can the contractor for ownership of the property or any part of the rights of the owner-occupant, be jeopardized.

It is furthermore arranged for each candidate for accommodation under this plan to submit to a life insurance examination, the premiums, however, to be paid by the foundation in such a way that the owner's family is relieved of all further payments in the event of the owner's death.

A banquet will be tendered the graduates tomorrow evening at the Touraine Hotel, Chatham.

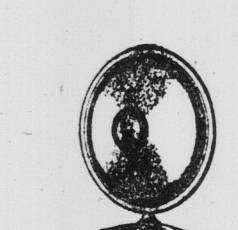
JOHNNY NEMIS WINS

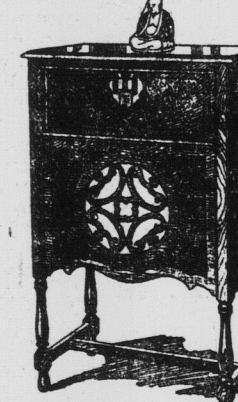

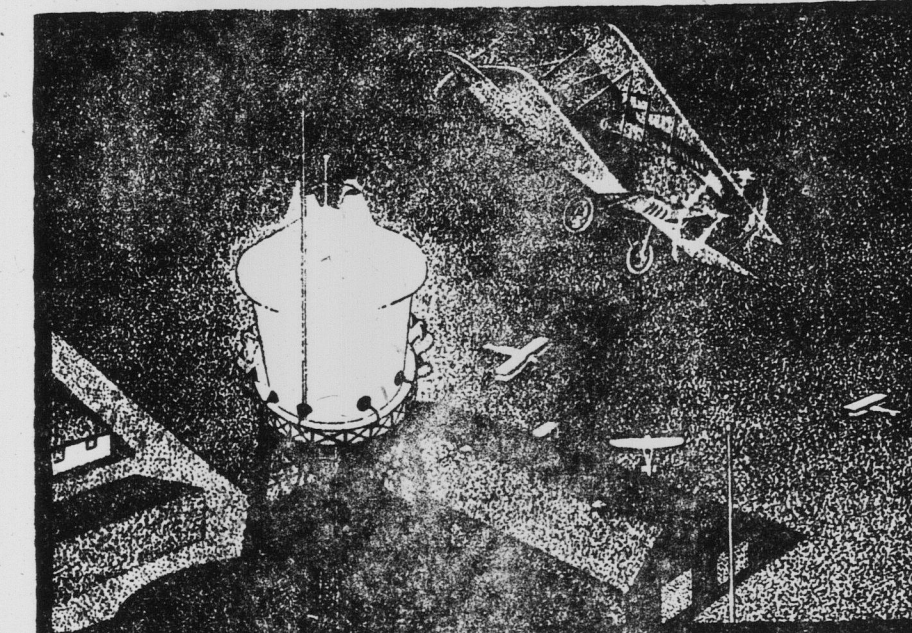

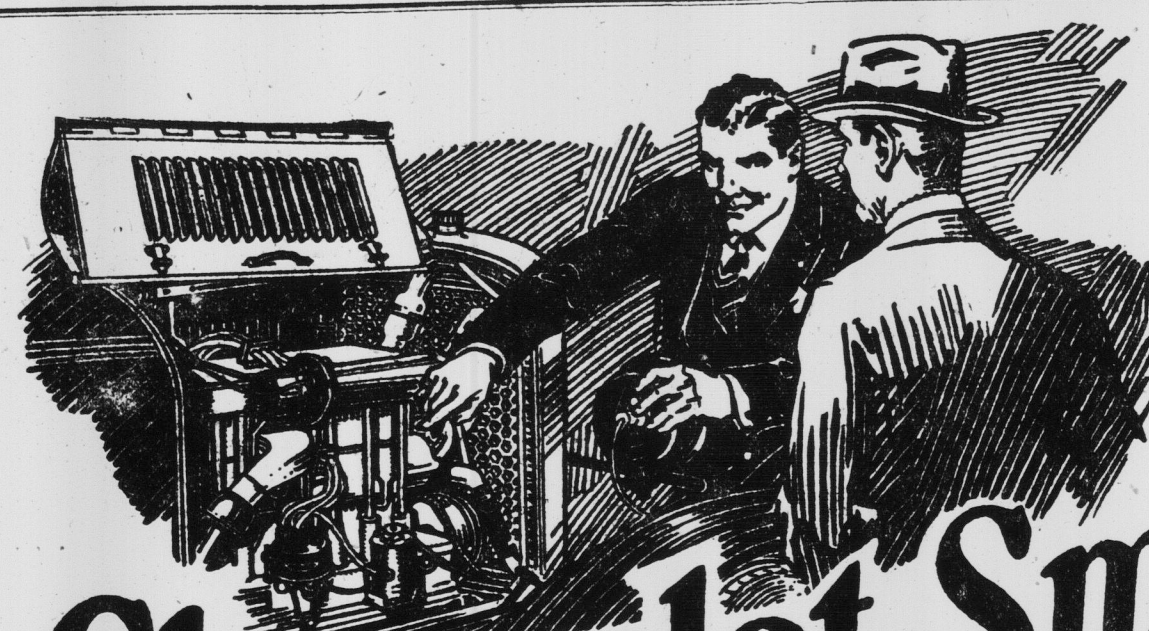
