LOOKS FOR SEVERE VOLCANIC EVENTS

Pele Student Predicts Greatest in Years in Hawaii—Some Tremors Registered.

Hilo, Island of Hawaii, T. H. June 9—The Goddess Pele, Hawaiian deity of volcanoes, who early last week stirred her fires long dormant craters, is brewing a terrible broil in her giant feasts under the lava cones, which at any moment she may pour out upon the country about her. Such, at any rate, is the forecast of Professor T. A. Jagger, volcanologist, who for years has studied Pele's moods. "I believe Madame Pele means mischief," Professor Jagger said today. "I am hourly expecting momentous events." The eruption, he said, may rival or even surpass the great outbreak of 1840, when the districts about the seaside villages of Kapoho, Kalapana and Kaimu were inundated with lava. Professor Jagger's prediction was based on the collapse last Monday of the Halemaumau pit in the Kilauea crater by the sudden draining out of the molten lava from the upper walls of the pit and the numerous earth tremors recorded at the volcano observatory near here. Events of the last few days are a repetition in exact sequence, Professor Jagger said, of the activity that preceded the 1840 eruption, when lava from Halemaumau drained away toward the craters of Makaopuhi and Napau on the great rift system extending along the coast in the regions of Kapoho and Kalapana. This was the phenomenon which this week restored the Makaopuhi crater to activity for the first time since 1840, and which at the same time subdued the Halemaumau fire pit. The tremors registered show intense activity along this line of the lava flow, the volcanologist said.


