PLAN TO REMOVE OVERHEAD WIRES

Conduit System Suggested by City Engineer and Electrician

Board of Health Matters—The Falls Bridge—Increased Exemption Asked For Rolling Mills—Mr. Taylor Replies to Statement re One-Man Cars.

The first steps towards the removal of all wires and poles from the streets of St. John was made at this morning's committee meeting of the common council when Mayor Schofield presented a report of the city engineer and city electrician on the matter.

On motion of Commissioner Frink, it was decided to let the matter lie on the table for further discussion at a meeting at which the city engineer and electrician would be present.

The mayor read a letter from George Cushing enclosing a letter received by him from Col. Monahan, in which the latter stated that there would be no engineering difficulty in raising the piers of the C. P. R. bridge at the falls.

Electrical contractors of the city wrote that they had withdrawn an objection which they made at a recent meeting to one of the proposed clauses in the electrical by-law amendments.

An application from Daniel Monahan for permission to erect an electric sign in Union street was referred to Commissioner Frink.

Commissioner Frink reported that he had taken up the matter of the removal of the street car tracks from the square, west, with the N. P. Power Co. and was informed that the company would consider the matter at a meeting to be held soon.

Fred. J. Nisbet, of the N. B. Telephone Co., was heard in connection with the relocation of poles in Millidge avenue. He said the line at Millidgeville was in bad shape and the company planned additional service this year.

Additional poles were ordered to be placed on the line, which they wanted to start work right away.

The mayor said the matter was held up while the city ascertained from other cities how they got rid of a lot of their poles.

To Commissioner Thornton, Mr. Nisbet said it was some time since any poles were painted.
