David drew the attention of the senate to the pronouncement of Lord Shaughnessy on the railway problem. Government ownership of railways had been proved in the United States, Russia and Canada to be a fallacy. Apparently Lord Shaughnessy had offered the only remedy for the railway muddle. The C. P. 
