INNOCENT SUFFER FOR OTHERS' CRIMES

A weakness in our social system which causes the innocent to suffer for the crimes of the guilty was exposed at yesterday's meeting of the Associated

Charities, when the story was told of the destitution of two wives and their children while their fathers are serving in long term in prison. The view was expressed that this province needs an industrial farm where such men could be set to work for at least a small wage to be given their dependents. The secretary, Miss Grace Robertson, submitted her report for April as follows: Applications received, 162; requests for employment, 89; employment was found for 21; recommended, 41; asking relief, 21; Relief was procured for 20; records given, 20; visits made,

88; cases investigated, 18; clothing was given to 7. Miss Robertson said there was still much unemployment and many families were in needy circumstances. She was given authority to give temporary relief in three urgent cases. The chairman, W. S. Fisher, remarked that conditions were far worse in many other cities than in St. John. William Young, treasurer, reported a healthy balance on hand but said it would be necessary to raise more before next winter's work comes on. The board adjourned until October, the work meanwhile to be carried on by the secretary.

GOVERNOR-GENERAL GIVES ADVICE TO VICTORIAN ORDER

Ottawa, May 11—"The best immigration agent in the world is the cradle," said His Excellency the Governor-General, who occupied the chair at the annual meeting of the Victorian Order of Nurses board of governors in the Chateau Laurier, today.

He said, "to bring up a strong, active, virile population of our own born on the place that is the surest way to develop this great land's resources. The organizations that help to that end are doing an enormous service for their country." His excellency urged close co-operation between the order and the Red Cross Society. He suggested that the Red Cross use its prestige to develop public sentiment, and supply money for the work of the Victorian Order.

Ottawa, May 11—Consideration of Canada's railway problem occupied the senate today. Senator L. O. David drew the attention of the senate to the pronouncement of Lord Shaughnessy on the railway problem. Government ownership of railways had been proved in the United States, Russia and Canada to be a fallacy. Apparently Lord Shaughnessy had offered the only remedy for the railway trouble. The C. P. R. was an efficient organization and the effect of the scheme would be to amalgamate the bankrupt Canadian National system with a rich and powerful company. Senator Turiff opposed this idea.
