#### MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

The conference between the coal miners and operators in Washington was broken off yesterday. The operators declined to go beyond their offer of a 14 per cent increase, and the miners held out for a 31 per cent increase, which had been promised by the secretary of labor. In a statement yesterday Wm. G. McAdoo, former secretary of the treasury, said that many operators must now be operating their mines on "velvet" because in 1917 they had made as high as 2,000 per cent on invested capital. Lionel H. Clarke of Toronto has been appointed lieutenant-governor of Ontario. Three names are being considered for the gubernatorial chair in British Columbia, Hon. E. H. Prior, M. A. C. Flummett and M. W. Nichol. J. H. Cook, Australian naval minister in Melbourne yesterday urged Great Britain to "keep her powder dry" in view of the aspirations of United States and Japan in their Pacific policy. George Watson and Fannie Lockner, charged with robbing Oscar Roberts of St. John of \$300 in Moncton, were found not guilty there yesterday and allowed to go. The moulders and core workers with the Dominion Iron & Steel Co., Sydney, went on strike yesterday for increased wages.

**LANCASHIRE BOOM**  
London, Nov. 27.—Industrial Lancashire is changing hands. Nearly 100 factories have been transferred to new owners, and cotton mill shares have changed hands at prices even as high as seven times their nominal and paid-up value. The Daily Mail says it is estimated in Lancashire that the boom will last anywhere from two to six years, and it is attributed to the fact that the world now wants dressing again and is pouring in orders for textile goods.
