STRIKE LEADERS ARE NOMINATED FOR LEGISLATURE

Winnipeg, April 8.—R. B. Russell, Geo. Armstrong, W. A. Pritchard and R. J. Johns, four of the convicted strike leaders, were nominated for seats in the provincial legislature at a meeting of the Winnipeg branch of the Socialist party of Canada last night.

As Rev. Wm. Ivens is on the tentative slate of nominations made by the dominion labor party last week, and Alderman Queen will, it is understood, be the nominee of the Social Democrat party, six of the seven strike leaders given full terms are likely to figure in what will undoubtedly be a unique election.

TWO MURDER CASES

Quebec, April 8.—(Canadian Press)—At the criminal assizes here yesterday, true bills were returned by a grand jury against Nick Deleka and George Mohary, accused with Mike Presko alias Charney, alias "Big Mike" and "Little George," of having murdered Lucien Morissette at Kenogami on July 27, 1919. Both men, who are Roumanians, pleaded not guilty.

True bills were also returned in the cases of Romeo Remillard and Joseph Remillard, of Riverville, Lewis, who are accused of having killed Lucien Morissette on the night of January 27-28, 1920. "Not guilty" was their answer to the charge.
