Glasgow, Scotland, March 31—The National Temperance Council for Scotland, presided over by Lord Rowallan, has been indefatigable through many years in its efforts to educate public opinion in favor of the idea that the people of the country should possess the power of direct veto over the issue and renewal of licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquors. Year after year its efforts were sustained; but it was not until Aug. 15, 1913, that the royal assent was given to the Temperance (Scotland) Act, which had been introduced into the House of Commons on March 12, 1912, by McKinnon Wood, the then secretary of state for Scotland. It was in no small degree due to the persistent and ably directed efforts of a branch of the National Temperance Council—the Scotish Permissive Bill and Temperance Association—that this end was attained.

of licensed premises on the 25th of May, 1914.

The main purpose of the act, which is described in the preamble as "an act to promote temperance," is to give the people in each district the power to say what they wish in one of three directions: (1) they can vote for no license, and thus secure prohibition; (2) they can vote for limitation of licenses, and these will be reduced by one-fourth; (3) they can vote for no change, and conditions will remain as they are. The machinery of the act includes the local electoral roll, the requisition for a poll, the poll, the licensing authority, and the town and county councils.

Requisition for Poil.

On August 15, 1920, the clerk of the local authority will be ready to issue forms for a requisition for a poll. This requisition must be signed by at least one-tenth of the electors, but no member of a licensing court can sign it; it must be lodged in September, and then be advertised and be open to inspection. The poll will be taken in November or December, probably on the same day as the town council or county council elections. All licensed premises in the areas concerned are to be closed during the hours of the poll. In burghs with not less than 25,000 inhabitants the area is the ward; but if any ward has a population below 4,000, the town council may, on or before January, 1920, combine that ward with a contiguous one. In the case of other burghs, the whole burgh is the area. In counties the area is the parish, exclusive of burghs or parts of burghs therein. The electors are the municipal or parish voters, including women whose names appear on the roil.



In 1918, the Social Democrat Party was declared an illegal organization by order-in-council. However, later the Social Democrat Party of Canada was excluded from the provisions of the order.

I. W. W. Active in Canada.

The I. W. W., which had gained such force in the United States since its inception at a secret council in Chicago fourteen years ago, has been present in Canadian mining and lumber camps for some time, especially in Northern Ontario and British Columbia. It is an organization of workers who believe in revolutionary doctrines, and recognize no laws. It publishes seventeen regular papers, besides thousands of booklets and hand-bills.

That the Bolshevism rampant in Russia and Hungary was actively supported by paid German agents was the statement of Mr. Cahan. Publications from these Soviets had been circulated almost as widely in Canada as in Rusisa. Here the chief work is amongst the Finns, whose publications are not only obscene, sacriligious, but also seditious and treasonable.


