MANY EGGS BEING SOLD FOR EXPORT

Receipts Throughout Country Heavy, But Demand is Unprecedented

(Toronto Mail and Empire Friday)

The egg market continues strong. Purchases for export are keeping pace with the increased receipts. A few eggs are

going into storage, but the movement is not as general. Twelve cars of eggs were exported to Great Britain or rolling to seaboard last week. Early this week it was reported the demand from Great Britain had slackened, due to the advancing price on this side. Since then, however, more enquiries have been received. In the United States it is said a much larger export trade could be done. The limited ocean steamship space is the one thing that is limiting the business. One Chicago dealer reports a sale for export of 7,000 cases.

Receipts of eggs throughout the country are very heavy, but the demand is unprecedented, and notwithstanding the heavy production prices have shown a further advance. Country shippers in Ontario report having paid stores from 42 to 44 cents and made sales at prices ranging from 43 to 45 cents f. o. b. for current receipts, cases returnable. One shipper reported that he was confronted with a buyer who came into his district offering 45 cents for stores. To meet this price and get out with a profit he will have to get 46 cents f. o. b. Offers from Winnipeg and Regina have been received in the East recently on a basis of 42 to 43 cents for firsts f. o. b. Western points, cases free. Production is increasing very rapidly in the Prairie provinces, and an increasing movement of eggs from the West to the East may be expected. Prices there are considered too high for storing, and as soon as a car lot can be accumulated it is shipped out.

Comparatively Cheap as Food Even at the present high level, eggs are cheap for food. Production is increasing very rapidly in the Prairie provinces, and an increasing movement of eggs from the West to the East may be expected. The United States markets have been steady to firm during the week, with slight fluctuations from day to day. The receipts at Chicago for the week were very heavy, but all offerings were taken either for export, storage or current consumption. It seems to be the general opinion of the trade that prices will not go lower during April. In other words, the undercurrent of the market is very firm. Storage packed firsts are quoted at Chicago at from 42 to 43 cents according to the producing section.

MOTOR CARS MAY USE THE MAIN TRUNK ROADS. MORE WORK PLANNED Supervisors of the roads in the district around St. John bounded by Sussex, Walsford and Oak Point, have reported that the frost is pretty well out of the trunk roads, and, consequently, the ban on motor-car traffic over these roads will be lifted this afternoon. The branch roads still show the effects of the frost and are not yet ready for traffic of this description. The provincial road engineer, B. M. Hill, has inspected the Tarvia construction completed in the Marsh road last year and has found that it stood up under winter conditions and now is in excellent condition. He has arranged with the Barrett Company to proceed with the work in the Brookville section on Monday next. The road engineer and E. S. Carter also inspected the road between Ferryburn and Robbsey and found it in good condition. Robbsey people are urging strongly that the Tarvia surface should be extended to their village and this is under consideration by the department.
