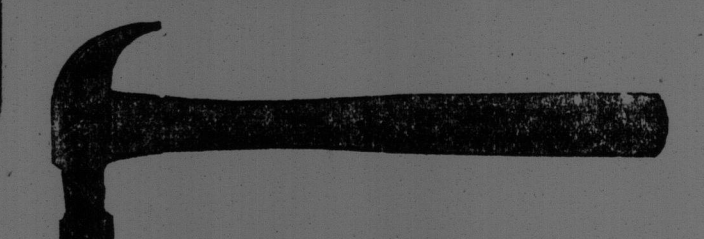

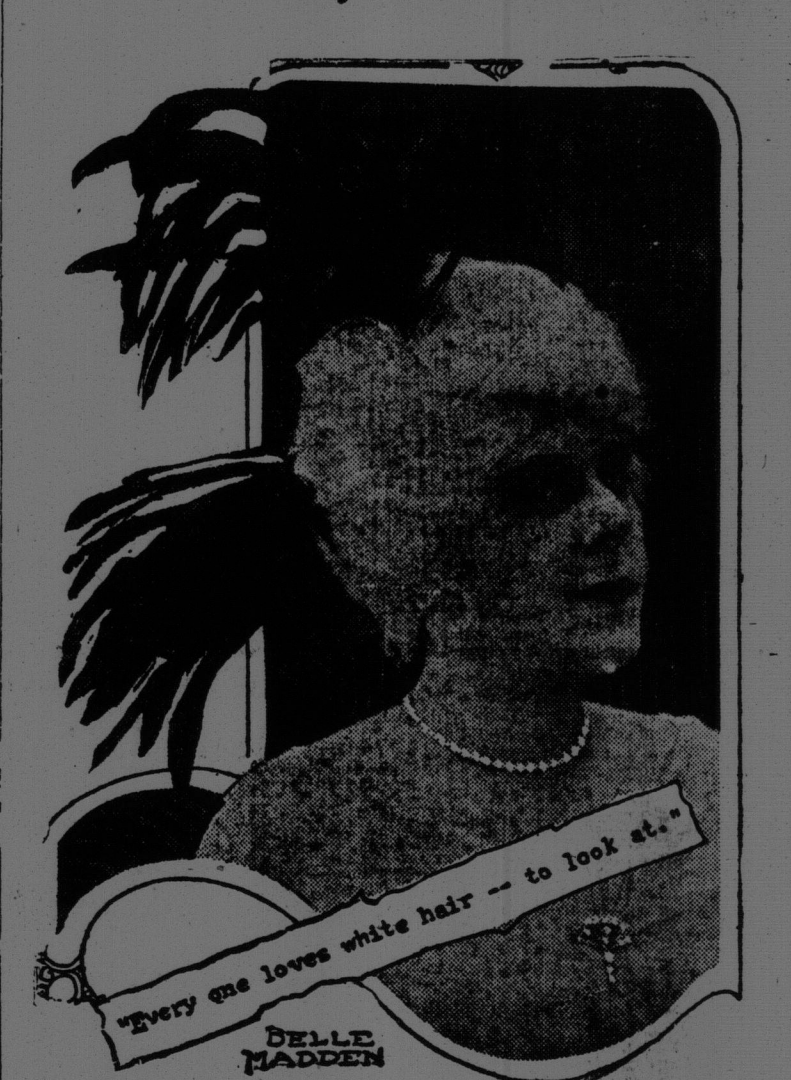

Says Belle Madden, Model

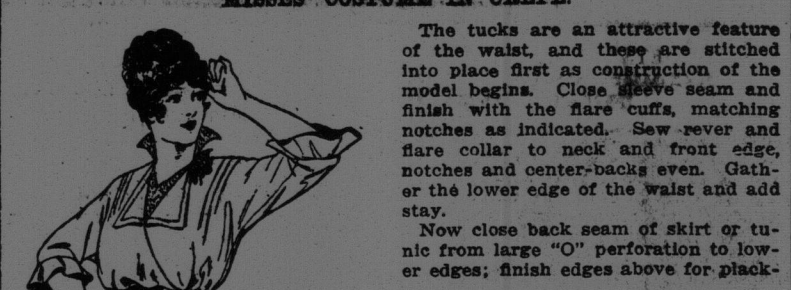

The tucks are an attractive feature of the waist, and these are stitched into place first as construction of the model begins. Close, narrow seam and finish with the flare cuffs, matching notches as indicated. Sew revers and flare collar to neck and front edge, notches and center-backs even. Gather the lower edge of the waist and add stay.  
Now close back seam of skirt or tulle from large "O" perforation to lower edge; finish edges above for pleck.
