

## SYNOD MEETS NEXT YEAR IN FREDERICTON

King's Board Representatives  
Chosen at Closing  
Session Here

HEARTY TRIBUTE IS  
PAID TO BISHOP

Insurance Committee Named  
—Good Words Spoken for  
Retiring Clergymen.

Eight representatives of the Fredericton Anglican diocesan synod were elected to the board of governors of the University of King's College, Halifax, at the closing session of the synod yesterday afternoon. They are: Rev. Thomas Parker, Rev. J. H. A. Holmes, Rev. Canon Smithers, Ven. Archdeacon Crowfoot, Chancellor I. J. F. Winslow, H. Usher Miller, J. F. H. Teed and J. H. A. L. Fairweather.

Rev. A. H. Moore, president of King's, who has been attending the sessions and whose work in restoring harmony between the Nova Scotia and Fredericton dioceses with respect to King's, elicited the warm praise of Bishop Richardson at the morning session, announced in the afternoon that a meeting of the board of governors had been called at Halifax for May 6, next.

**TRIBUTE TO BISHOP.**

A warm tribute to the affection and esteem in which Bishop Richardson is held was paid at the closing session when a motion of thanks to His Lordship was carried by a standing vote. In moving this resolution, as he has done for several years past now, Ven.

erable Archdeacon Forsyth, Chatham, said that the success and satisfaction that has always attended the synod meetings were largely due to the wise and kindly presidency of the Bishop. The motion was seconded by H. Usher Miller while Very Rev. Dean Neales, in presenting the thanks of the synod to the Bishop, said it was given most sincerely.

Under Bishop Richardson's enlightened leadership, the diocese had prospered and he prayed he would be spared many more years to continue his work. Bishop Richardson replied feelingly.

**TO MEET IN FREDERICTON.**

Dean Neales and Rev. A. F. Bates, Fredericton, joined in extending an invitation for the synod to meet next year in Fredericton and this was accepted. The fixing of the date was left to the executive committee.

**ON "SPEAKING OUT."**

F. T. Short's motion that the synod ask the clergy to conduct their services in a clear and distinct voice was adopted unanimously. Some good-humored comment was occasioned by this motion. Dean Neales started to say something on the motion but cries of "speak out" interrupted him followed by a gale of laughter.

The dean said that while it was true the clergy could very well speak out more clearly, some improvement would also be made if the laity made the responses more clearly than is the case. The motion could hardly apply to him, he said, as he had often been accused of speaking too loud. (Laughter.)

"In fact," said the dean, "people have told me they have stayed outside to hear the service." (Much laughter.)

**INSURANCE COMMITTEE**

Rev. E. P. Wright's motion that wherever possible members of Synod committees be members of the Synod was carried unanimously.

His Lordship announced he had appointed the following as the personnel of the insurance committee: Colonel B. R. Armstrong, W. A. Harrison, J. H. A. L. Fairweather, H. Usher Miller, Rev. A. L. Fleming, Archdeacon Newnham. This committee will report next year to a mutual insurance plan.

A resolution expressing a sense of loss through the death of A. W. McMackin, a prominent member of St. Paul's church, Rothesay, was adopted by a standing vote.

## WILSON COLLEGE TO TRAIN DIPLOMATS

Senator Hains Declares South is  
Victim of Discrimination  
in Appointments.

SAVANNAH, Ga., April 30.—United States Senator William J. Harris of Georgia urges that the proposed college, planned as a memorial for Woodrow Wilson, shall become a training school for diplomats, especially of men of Southern birth.

In a letter to Pleasant A. Stovall, head of the movement to establish a college bearing Wilson's name in his native state, Senator Harris expresses the belief that Southern people are now unjustly discriminated against in consular and diplomatic appointments and says that while a line drawn from San Francisco to Baltimore would place more than half of the nation to the south, this territory has only a negligible representation in foreign service appointments.

**REGRETS DEPARTURE**

A resolution, moved by Rev. S. C. Gray and Rev. J. V. Young, expressing the regret of the Diocese over the retirement from parochial duties of Ven. Archdeacon Newnham and Rural Dean W. H. Sampson, carried unanimously.

His Lordship the Bishop spoke eloquently on this motion. In replying Ven. Archdeacon Newnham said he had been fifty-six years in the service of the church and felt he had earned a little rest.

The three committees of the Synod, the executive committee, standing committee and the board of missions met after the close of the Synod session and organized for the coming year. Routine business only was transacted. Ven. Archdeacon O. S. Newnham.

## Digby County Mills Are Being Kept Busy

DIGBY, April 30.—Lumbering operations have been carried on on a large scale in Digby county during the last six months, and today all the mills throughout the county are busy trying to catch up with a large number of orders which have accumulated and which the mill owners were unable to fill until the present date. 


