Daily Hints For the Cook

Creamed String Beans. String the green beans and cut up in half-inch pieces (enough to make a quart). Boil in salted water until tender. Drain and put back in the saucepan, add a piece of butter the size of an egg, salt and pepper to taste and 1/2 cup of cream. Let it come to the boiling point and serve.

Sponge Cake. Beat the yolks of six eggs very light. Add a quarter of a pound of granulated sugar and beat again. Whip whites of six eggs to a stiff froth, then beat in gradually a quarter of a pound of granulated sugar. Add this to the yolks and beat both until thoroughly mixed. Fold in lightly a quarter of a pound of sifted flour. Finally add one teaspoon of lemon juice. Bake in a moderate oven about 20 minutes or until cakes begin to shrink from the pans.
