I am an inmate of above institution and I am serving a sentence of twelve months Def. and six months indefinite for false pretence at Hamilton by Magistrate Burbridge. I have completed three months of my Sentence and I am sure if you can see your way clear to secure me a cut in sentence I will join the Army at once. I am physically fit and see no reason why I should not do my bit for the country of my birth. I am of French Descent and twenty two years of age, five feet eleven inches and one hundred and fifty nine lbs. This is my first time behind prison bars for me and I am sure I have learned my lesson. I know promises from a man in my position are not credited as of much value but I can assure you sir, that any effort on your part in so far as paving the way for my release to the Armed Forces will not be abused. I shall soldier as good as any man in uniform. I trust that if you are not in a position to intercede in this matter you may be generous enough to pass it to some one who may assist me in this matter of importance. I trust that you will regard this request as an appeal from one in need of assistance and who has learned by bitter but profitable experience how to appreciate his Liberty and the Good Will of all men.
