WEEKLY WEATHER SYNOPSIS.

Victoria Meteorological Office, The weather during this week was unusually fine on the Lower Mainland and Vancouver Island, while along the north coast of this province considerable rain was reported, and in Cariboo some snow. These conditions were caused by the marked hovering of high barometric pressure over this vicinity, while to the southward the barometer was low. Sharp frosts occurred on the Lower Mainland upon the first four days and in this vicinity on three days. The winds have been mostly from the northward and no high winds occurred either on the Coast, Straits and Sound. During this period considerable rain fell in California. Upon Tuesday, 10th, the barometric pressure 4th to 10th March, 1908.

Tuesday, 10th, the barometric pressure decreased in advance of an ocean storm area approaching the Coast. This move-ment caused a marked rise in temperature throughout the province and also east-ward to the prairie provinces. At Cal-gary the temperature rose to 56, and 60 at Medicine Hat.
