Company Severely Criticized for Its Failure to Take Prompt Action to Locate the Hull.

The Vessel Equipped with Faulty Life Preservers—Lieut. Ross Would Prevent Side Wheel Steamers from Running When They Might be Carried Out to Sea.

BOSTON, Dec. 5.—Dr. Joshua A. Lewis of the state board of charity, returned from Cape Cod today.

He believes that the steamer was overwhelmed by the terrific seas that prevailed during the hurricane, and that after her top hull had been washed away she tilted and sank.

He does not doubt that many bodies have been washed ashore and washed out again in the undertow that might have been recovered had the company hired a number of men sufficient to patrol every part of the coast thoroughly.

Dr. Lewis believes that a great number of bodies are now being washed ashore, and that the company should have taken prompt action to locate the hull.
