

The Toronto street Railway is a good money maker. During 1910 the City received \$596,297 from the Toronto Railway Company, besides mileage allowances and taxes, during the year just passed, an increase in percentage receipts alone of over \$88,significance of this fact is apparent when it is stated that the city now receives one-fifth of all increased receipts. On this basis it is easy to calculate that during 1910, the Toronto Railway Company got from the public over \$422,000 more than in

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties-Six months residence and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or in his fathe, mother, son, daughter

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—must reside upon the homestead Wm.
