## May Not Arrive Till Tomorrow.

From the last report received from  
the S. S. Saturnia, it is not expected  
that she will enter port before ten  
o'clock tonight, and probably not un-  
til tomorrow morning. At Monday  
noon she was 640 miles east of Cape  
Sable and even making faster pro-  
gress than the early days of the  
voyage, she could not make an earlier  
entry than around midnight tonight.

## Oil Tanker Disabled.

Halifax, April 8.—In tow of the  
United States tug Iniquity, the Amer-  
ican oil tanker J. H. Guffey, arrived in  
port this morning from St. Johns,  
Nfld., to which port she was taken  
in February, after having been picked  
up at sea disabled.

## Her Rudder Disabled.

With her rudder disabled the New-  
foundland schooner Metamore, Cap-  
tain Carver, bound from Jamaica to  
St. John's, with a cargo of sugar, put  
into Halifax Monday morning.

## Nova Scotia News.

The handsome stern schooner St.

one of the finest schooners built in  
Nova Scotia for some time and the  
other ship, the "Annie B. Anderson,"  
built from the same design and model  
has proved herself to be a marvel of  
speed and carrying capacity.

## Abandoned Southern Trip.

sprang a leak while on the passage  
from St. John to Barbados, and put  
into North West Harbor, and was  
afterwards towed to Yarmouth and  
Meteghan for repairs, has abandoned  
her southern trip and will go to the  
Magdalen Islands for a cargo of fish  
for her owners in Beaver Harbor.  
Her cargo of lumber and shingles,  
which the vessel was carrying to  
Barbados, and the schooner purchased  
by the Canadian Wood Working Co.,  
Ltd., and the cargo is being landed at  
T wharf, Yarmouth.
