

### TAMMANY BOSS INDICTED FOR INTIMIDATION

Alleged to Have Made Attempts to Coerce Manufacturer Into Returning \$125,000 Which He Invested With Him.

### DISTRICT ATTY. ALSO INDICTED

Alleged to Have Used Grand Jury Summons to Assist Murphy in His Coercion.

New York, June 23.—Charles F. Murphy, Tammany leader, was one of the six men secretly indicted yesterday by the extraordinary Grand Jury, which has been investigating alleged attempts of Mr. Murphy to intimidate Louis N. Hartog, a manufacturer, into returning \$125,000 which he invested with Hartog's company during the war.

With Mr. Murphy were indicted Assistant District Attorney James E. Smith, John A. McCarthy, former business partner of John Murphy, brother of Charles F. Murphy; Arthur J. Baldwin, a lawyer; Ernest B. Waldon, Vice-President of the Corn Products Company, and the Corn Products Company itself.

The indictments, it was learned today, charged that the defendants conspired to coerce Hartog to settle a suit for \$10,000,000 damages which he brought against Murphy after the latter is alleged to have withdrawn his support from Hartog's company. Bail for each defendant was fixed at \$1,000.

**Murphy Controlled Glucose.**

Hartog was head of a company which manufactured a product of which glucose is the chief ingredient. He got a \$7,000,000 order from the British Government during the war, but found difficulty in obtaining the necessary glucose. Thereupon, it is alleged, he expanded his company, and when he obtained Murphy's support no longer had difficulty in getting glucose from the Corn Products Company.

After Hartog and Murphy are alleged to have had a falling out, Murphy sued Hartog to recover his \$125,000 investment, and Hartog then sued Murphy, the Corn Products Company and Baldwin and McCarthy to recover \$10,000,000 profit which he said he lost as a result of Murphy withdrawing his support. He claimed he could no longer get glucose from the Corn Products Company.

At the time these court actions were pending, Smith summoned Hartog to his office. Hartog claimed Smith summoned him to force him to pay Murphy his \$125,000, but Smith asserted he had issued the summons at a time when he was engaged in prosecuting sugar profiteers.

Hartog's brother was fined \$5,000 in the Federal Court for profiteering, but Hartog himself was given a clean bill by Mr. Smith. It was charged at the time that Mr. Smith wrongfully used the process of a Grand Jury subpoena to intimidate Hartog.

### Common Council Met In Committee

Took up Matter of Water Extension Yesterday But No Action Was Taken—East and West Side Water Service Discussed.

The common council in its regular committee meeting yesterday morning took up the matter of water extension, but as usual failed to take any action on the question.

Commissioner Jones presented a report on the proposed extension to Spruce Lake and recommended that a 36 inch concrete main be laid from the present 24 inch main at an estimated cost of \$357,400. This would give a daily flow of 12,000,000 gallons and after supplying the pulp mill with all the water it needed would have about 8,000,000 gallons for the general public, about four times as much as is coming in now. The estimated revenue from the pulp mill would be about \$7,000 a year.

Commissioner Frink called attention to the need for a new main to care for the needs of the east side and ventured the statement that this would probably cost \$1,000,000.

Mayor Schofield suggested the linking up of the east and west side water services.

### FRANCE ELATED OVER INDEMNITY

Yearly Contribution by Germany Toward Reconstruction Sadly Needed.

### LOANS ARE STILL NEEDED

Press Sees Necessity of Attracting Foreign Aid to Ruined Areas.

Paris, June 23.—While the Parisian newspapers generally accept the earlier reports of the Hythe and Boulogne conferences with reserves until confirming action is taken by the Premier, there is a distinct sense of elation over the prospect that Germany will be called upon to pay something yearly for the rebuilding of the ruined areas.

But the three billions of marks gold proposed means only a drop in the bucket of French responsibilities, and the shrewd writers foresee that France herself will have to arrange external loans if the liberated regions are to be restored to prosperity. This is stressed in L'Avantur, in which Charles Chaumet writes: "France does not represent herself

as a suppliant or complainant. Confident of her destiny, she is already at work, and despite economic difficulties grave and numerous, her situation is ameliorating continuously. Her finances all will be assured by an energetic and courageous fiscal effort."

This effort, Andre Tardieu suggests in the Petit Parisien, must involve attracting the attention of foreign money holders to France's necessity. Any loan attempted hereafter for reconstruction must be with the assurance that the proceeds will be devoted only to that purpose and not for the general rehabilitation of the French treasury.

The prospect of the Greek troops being sent to Turkey has failed to arouse great interest, although it was evident that M. Millerand will have to explain why he has abandoned the French view that the Turkish treaty must be revised if conflict with Moslem interests is to be averted. The intrajugoslav asks pointedly what is to be Venizelos's recompense from the Allies for shouldering the burden of occupation, and adds:

"The opposition of Marshal Foch, Sir Henry Wilson and Italy signifies that if the Greeks are defeated they cannot count upon British or French troops succoring them. But if Greece succeeds, it aids relieve the British troops at British; then is Venizelos to be allowed to install himself in Constantinople?"

Toronto, June 24.—Dr. Thomas J. Glover who many believe has discovered a positive cure for cancer, conducted his second public general clinic for inoperable cancer patients at St. Michael's Hospital this morning.
