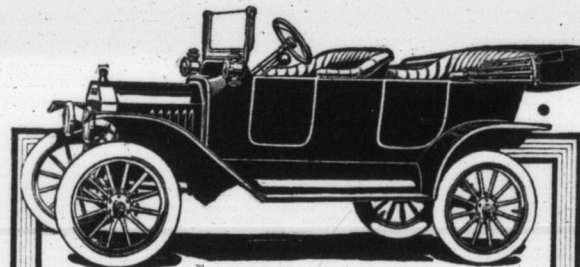

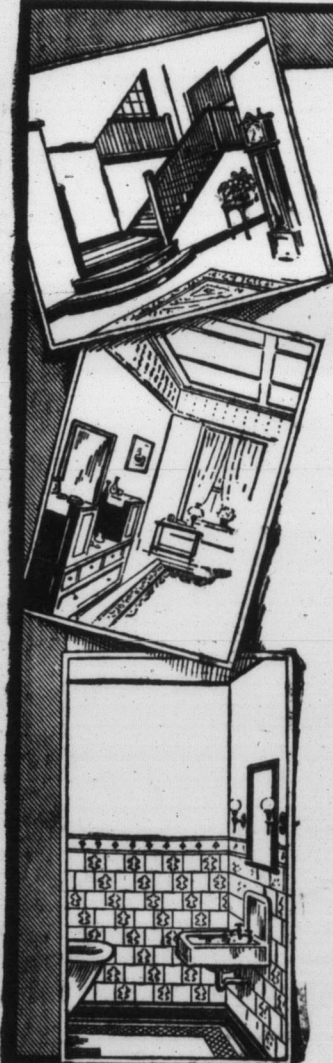

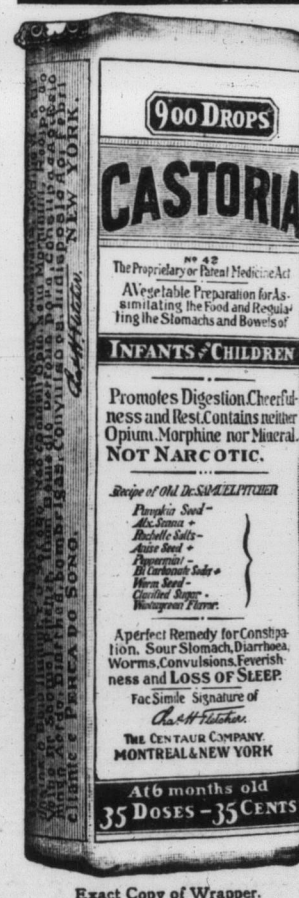
People of all classes that need help are looking about for intelligent, industrious, well-behaved, gentlemanly boys. A boy of that kind is laying a good foundation for success in life.

Oiling the streets has so far proved satisfactory in Glencoe, and the results would be even better if people could be induced to drive in the centre of the road as much as possible where the oil does not cover the whole roadway.

The post office department should do away with the war stamp for letters and issue a three-cent stamp covering both postage and war tax. People who inadvertently omit to add an extra stamp when mailing their letters would be saved no little annoyance.

Manners and morals will not be neglected in the teaching of Ontario's children. The withdrawal of the first book on the subject has made way for "The Golden Rule Books," which the Minister of Education has authorized. He has notified inspectors that these books on manners and morals must be in the hands of pupils by September next.

The question of holding elections on New Year's Day may now be considered by every municipal council, previous to the 15th day of November, the latest date on which a by-law providing therefor can be passed in any year.
