RUSSIAN SOVIET TO BE ADMITTED TO CONFERENCE

RUSSIA'S APPEARANCE AT THE PEACE CONFERENCE Is To Be Decided at Today's Deliberations

PARIS, Jan. 22.—That a limited number of representatives of the Russian soviet government will attend the peace conference seemed certain today. It was learned that an agreement had practically been reached by the Supreme Council in this regard. An official announcement was expected before night.

AFTER THREE DAYS OF DISCUSSION PARIS, Jan. 22.—(By William Philip Simms).—Russia's international status was to be determined by the associate powers today. For the third successive day the Russian situation constituted the principal business of the Supreme Council. The delegates were confident that a definite agreement would be reached on the question of some form of representation at the peace congress for the soviet government.

PEOPLE'S LAND HUNGER AND THEIR SOCIAL STATUS Have Become Vital Problems

MUST BE WISELY HANDLED PARIS, Jan. 22. (Copyrighted by United Press).—A tidal wave of restless humanity will sweep across the world like an invasion of the Goths in the middle ages unless the Peace Congress exercises foresight in handling the vast role of immigration. An economic, industrial and social calamity can be averted only by satisfying the people's land hunger and elevating their social status. This was the view expressed today by the American commission, which has been investigating conditions in European countries.

U.S. Finds Order Generally Maintained

FEW BREAKAGES OF THE RULES AMERICAN HEADQUARTERS IN GERMANY, Jan. 22. (By Webb Miller).—In six weeks occupation of a territory with three quarters of a million population the Third U. S. Army military courts have tried only 123 Germans for infraction of regulations. This indicates the remarkable orderliness resulting from American occupation. Most of the arrests have been for violation of the liquor rules and the purchase of American foodstuffs from soldiers. In only two cases has the maximum fine of 5,000 marks (\$1,000) been imposed. One was for armed resistance to an American officer by a German soldier. Another German soldier was sentenced to ninety days' imprisonment for a brawl with a doughboy. At Hertzsch, 28 persons were fined for stealing eyes of the British law, constituted the most flagrant form of sedition. Ireland stood before the world today as a republic on paper.

"Hands Off" Is Stand Taken By British Gov't

DUBLIN, Jan. 22.—The attitude of the British government towards the new Irish republic was the principal subject of speculation here today. So far the imperial authorities have maintained a policy of "hands off" utterly ignoring the proceedings of the Irish parliament which in late yesterday, adopted a declaration of independence and appointed a committee to represent Ireland at the peace conference. The meeting yesterday, which lasted only an hour and a half, passed without incident. The government authorities made no effort even to police the Mansion house, the Sinn Feiners providing their own guards to maintain order. About 2000 persons were present, including many women and children. The proceedings were conducted largely in Gaelic, although the declaration of independence was read in English and French. Charles Burgess acted as chairman. The peace delegates selected were Count Plunkett, Prof. Edward De Valera and Arthur Griffiths. The latter two are in prison. The aged count apparently will have to go to Paris alone to present Ireland's claims for the right of self-determination. He must travel on British passports.

CONSERVATIVE ELEMENTS WILL CONTROL GERMANY

Herr Naumann May Be Its First President

NATIONAL ASSEMBLY TO MEET AT WEIMAR. COPENHAGEN, Jan. 22.—The conservative element will control the German national assembly if a coalition is effected among the three parties constituting that faction, it was indicated by the latest available returns from the elections today. While the Majority Socialists will apparently dominate any single party in the national assembly, they will be out-voted by the combination of conservative delegates, even with the addition of extreme radical votes. As a result of the suppression of the recent Spartacan revolt, by the Majority Socialist government, it is regarded as doubtful that the two branches of the Left (Independent and Extreme Radicals) can get together. The only candidate who appears to have any chance to replace Chancellor Ebert is Mathias Erzberger, chairman of the German armistice commission and leader of the Centrist party. He was elected to the national assembly from a Berlin district. Berlin reports today indicated that an agreement had been reached to hold the national assembly in Weimar capital of the Province of Saxe-Weimar-Eisenach. Weimar is located on the left bank of the Ilm, 13 miles east of Erfurt. It has a population of about 35,000.

A DEMOCRAT MAY BECOME BERLIN, Jan. 22.—Berlin newspapers generally predicted today that Herr Naumann, Democrat, would be the first president of the new German republic and that Chancellor Ebert, Majority Socialist, would remain as head of the ministry. The German Democratic party is a combination of the old Progressives and Liberals.

AMERICAN HEADQUARTERS IN GERMANY, Jan. 22.—Women overtook the men in the districts occupied by the Third U. S. Army, according to incomplete returns from Sunday's national election. It was indicated that the Centrists (a coalition of the Catholic party and the Protestants) here held twice as many votes as all other parties combined. EBERT GOVERNMENT GAINED WIDE SUPPORT. COPENHAGEN, Jan. 22.—Of 319 delegates already reported elected to the National Assembly, the Majority Socialists, German Democrats and Centrists, which support the Ebert government, control 247 seats. The remainder are scattered among the Opposition.

Burlington and Hydro Radial Ry. Service Old Council Resigned Over Matter.

BURLINGTON, Ont., Jan. 22.—The first shot in the campaign to elect six new members of the town council here was fired last night when the citizens of Burlington crowded the town hall, many of them having to stand and some not able to gain admittance. Between 300 and 400 were present. The meeting unanimously passed a resolution, moved by the Rev. A. Andrews, that no further time be wasted in negotiation with the radial company, and that the most prompt possible action be taken to secure a Hydro-electric radial service between the town of Burlington and the city of Hamilton.

Empress of Britain Has Reached Halifax

HALIFAX, N. S., Jan. 22.—With several icicles hanging to her bows the C. P. R. S. S. Empress of Britain, with 71 officers, sixty cadets and 2,996 other ranks docked at 8.30 o'clock this morning. She had arrived at 2 a.m. but did not pull into the pier till daylight broke.

Former King Manuel Said to be off Lisbon

MADRID, Jan. 22.—Manuel II, the former King of Portugal, has left Lisbon aboard a ship of unknown nationality, according to unconfirmed reports received here today. This dispatch is not confirmed from any source. Other reports said that Lisbon is quiet and that military police are guarding the governor's palace. Prendergast, who became head of the government, following the recent assassination of President Paes, was reported to have been arrested in Oporto by the monarchists. He is released after signing an agreement with the monarchists. Contemporary reports said that Manuel had been proclaimed King in Lisbon, that a new cabinet had been formed and that the royalist ministers had occupied the official palaces. His monarchist forces were reported to have been completely victorious throughout the northern provinces. Valencia was occupied by 1,500 Royalist troops after a brief resistance. The republicans were reported to have been publicly burned in towns throughout the country. A state of siege has been proclaimed throughout Portugal according to some reports.

Poland Asks a Seat at the Peace Conference

AT THE PEACE CONFERENCE ARSAW, Jan. 21.—Ignace Paderewski, President of the New Polish republic, having completed the formation of a cabinet, has sent a note to the Allies requesting recognition of the Provisional Government of Poland as one of the allies.

MARTIAL LAW IN TIPPERARY DUBLIN, Jan. 22.—Following murder of two policemen in Tipperary, the government has declared martial law in this and other districts of Ireland. The Irish parliament continued its meetings today but no action was taken against it. RAILWAYMEN CRITICIZED BRITISH GOVERNMENT LONDON, Jan. 22.—A meeting representing two hundred thousand railway workers last night severely criticized the Lord George government for its apathy towards their demand for larger pay and shorter hours.

TO ASSIST IN GOOD WORK At the sitting of the County Council this morning a deputation of representatives of the Salvation Army and other citizens appeared making a request for a grant of \$5000 to the Salvation Army towards the purpose of taking care of the men and women who have been doing war work overseas and now that the war is over they are looking after the needs of men as they return to this country. And their efforts have met with great success, generally appreciated throughout the County. Adjutant Turner of Toronto, who spoke and made a glowing appeal in his interesting review of the work in Canada. His words were supplemented by brief addresses by Mr. C.K. Hagstrom, Mr. R. Smyth, Mr. L.J. Breithaupt and Mr. J.P. Scully. The Council referred the matter to the Finance Committee and discussed the request this afternoon when the resumed sitting was held. The committee recommended a grant of \$2,500.00 be made, after some discussion an amendment was made on the motion of Deputy Reeve Mather and seconded by Reeve Bohlender that the \$2,000.00 be granted. The matter was carried.

U. S. Politicians Are Making Some Trouble

BY CRITICISM OF PERSHING'S METHODS. AMERICAN HEADQUARTERS IN GERMANY, Jan. 21. (By Webb Miller).—Congressman Gallivan's recent speech alleging discrimination against national guard officers, has aroused much discussion among the military officials of the army of occupation. The general opinion seems to be that Gallivan's attitude is merely the result of "politics." Several officers pointed out today that General Pershing was ruthless in dealing with inefficiency and incompetence; that he relieved a number of officers, including a big percentage of regulars, regardless of politics and friendship, whenever it was discovered they were unfit. Each of these cases was reviewed, it was said and sufficient reasons shown for every relief from command.

Aviation Conference To be Held at Paris

TO FRAME INTERNATIONAL AIR RULES PARIS, Jan. 22. (By Henry Wood).—An allied aviation conference will be held here within a few days, for the purpose of drafting an aeroplane clause to be incorporated in the peace settlement. Great Britain, the United States, France, Italy and Belgium will be represented by aviation experts chosen largely from their aviation departments. One of the questions that is certain to be considered is that of providing regulations preventing airplanes, engaged in international mercantile traffic, from flying over frontiers and delivering their cargoes without the formality of stopping at a custom house and paying duty. Another provision that will be studied is that of making it impossible for the large fleet of commercial airplanes that he enemy has under construction to be suddenly converted into bombing squadrons. The aeroplane clause of the peace treaty will probably serve as the basis for future aviation laws.

With The American Red Cross Society

Eighteen Months Overseas. Nursing Sister Burge whose home is in Peterburg, arrived here yesterday after an absence of eighteen months in France.
