

BURCHILL, JOHN PERCIVAL. (*Northumberland.*)

B. at Miramichi, N.B., 1855. Is a mem. of the firm of George Burchill & Sons, merchants, there. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e., 1882. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e., 1886. Re-elected, March, 1887, to fill the vacancy caused by resignation of Mr. Adams, the mem. elect., to run for the Commons. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Nelson, N.B.*

COLTER, THOMAS HENRY. (*York.*)

Father and mother were both natives of Irel. B. in Sheffield, Co. of Sunbury. Ed. at a country school and at the Fredericton Grammar Sch. M. Miss Maggie Cliff. Is a farmer. Has been a Municipal Councillor for 9 years and Warden of the Co. of York for 2 years. Is Deputy Grand Master of the Orangemen of N.B. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at bye-election held, 23 Oct., 1890. A Conservative.—*Mouth of Keswick, N.B.*

DOUGLAS, WILLIAM. (*Charlotte.*)

Of Scotch descent. B. in St. Andrews, N.B., and ed. at St. Stephen. M., 1865, Sarah Eldridge. Is a farmer and lumber merchant, and has been a County Councillor for ten years. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1882. First returned to House of Assem. at g.e. 1886 and re-elected by acclamation at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Moore's Mills, N.B.*

HANINGTON, DANIEL L., Q.C. (*Westmoreland.*)

Of English and Royalist descent. S. of the late Hon. Daniel Hanington, late Presdt. of L.C., and grands. of Wm. Hanington, Esq., of London, Eng., who settled in Shediac in 1784, and was the first English resident there, and of Wm. Peters, Esq., M.P.P., of Queen's Co., gentleman. B. at Shediac, 27 June, 1835. M., Oct., 1861, Emily Myers, dau. of the late T. R. Wetmore, Esq., Gagetown, N.B. Called to the Bar of N.B. 1861. Apptd. Q.C. 11 Nov., 1881. Was Clerk of Circuits and of the County Court for Westmoreland from 1867 to 1870, when he resigned to contest the election of that year. Was first returned to House of Assem. Dec., 1870, for the Co. of Westmoreland. Sat therein until the summer of 1874. Was then defeated on the "Bible and religious instruction in common schools" question, which he advocated. Was elected at g.e. 1878, 1882,
