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Nearly 5,000 defense department personnel with access to nuclear weapons were removed from their positions last year for causes ranging from drug abuse to negligence.

Representative Les Aspin (a Democrat from Wisconsin and), a well-known Pegtagon critic released the figures today, (Tuesday) saying that, "any unstable individual having access to nuclear weapons amounts to our own version of Russian Roulette." Pentagon figures obtained by Aspin show that the individuals were removed for drug abuse, physical and mental problems and instability, negligence, behavior disorders and alcohol abuse.

According to a directive from the Department of Defense, those having access to nuclear weapons are described as being in (quote) "Physical proximity to a nuclear weapon in such a manner as to allow the opportunity to cause a nuclear explosion."
