

the parcel of land is \$300.00, being at the rate of \$10.00 per acre.

There is no doubt that an addition to the present Reserve at Fisher's Grant occupied by those Indians, which only contains 80 acres, is very desirable as there are some 38 families in the Band and the extent of Reserve land owned by them amounts to  $80 + 50 = 130$  acres, the other fifty acres being situated on the Strait of Northumberland. It is also apparent that such of the Indians as live at Fisher's Grant are in want of wood for the purposes of fuel, fencing, and building, and the parcel of land now offered to the Department contains timber.

The
