Ball spent morning at Station 18-3-40 Regarding layout of W/T Station and D.F. Station. Camp Borden, Ont. 19-3-40 Blinding snow squalls with heavy wind. One Harvard forced to land at Island Airport. Returned to base in afternoon. F/O. Hone returned from Georgian Bay in Fairchild with balance of equipment used in setting up camp and salvaging Battle which forced landed on ice. A very commendable bit of salvage work and F/O Hone deserves all the credit for the organization. Camp Borden. Ont.
