
Ottawa 29th July, 1920.

Sir,-

Referring to your letter of the 6th instant, and the accounts which you submitted for repairs to the Jackson Barn, I beg to say that the said accounts should have been sent to the Department in duplicate. You delayed in forwarding them, and when you sent them in they should have been in proper form.

With reference to the payment which you made in the case of Geo. Goose, I have to point out that if he worked 21 days, as is shown, it would seem that he is entitled to receive \$52.50, not \$32.50. You should state whether this man accepted \$32.50 in full for his services for the period mentioned. The statement which you submitted showing expenditure to the amount of \$115.50 is re-enclosed herewith to be checked over by you. When it is returned corrected payment will be made by the Department for the expenditure incurred by you in excess of the advance of \$300.00 which you received for the work.
