No. 504. Your telegram No. 219 of February 19th, regarding proposal to send Canadian firemen to the United Kingdom.

United Kingdom Government feel need for trained personnel is pressing, and is anxious that it should still be found possible to make some other arrangements to enable Canadian firemen to come over for service in the United Kingdom.

At a meeting with the Home Secretary and Mr. Malcolm Macdonald, it was proposed that Mr. Macdonald should take the matter up with the Canadian Government on his arrival, on the understanding, mentioned in your telegram under reference, that the United Kingdom Government will assume responsibility for the organization, control and compensation of Canadian firemen. Mr. Macdonald has been furnished with memorandum containing possible basis for volunteer scheme for Canadian firemen, and authorities here most anxious that it should be given consideration. As regards pay, it is felt that pay issued to Canadian volunteers in the United Kingdom should not exceed pay normally issued to equivalent ranks of firemen in the United Kingdom. It is, however, realized that this may entail hardship, especially to firemen with family responsibilities in Canada, and it is hoped that means may be found to meet difference between United Kingdom and Canadian rates in pay and
