difficult to bridge over. To Dr. Thompson there came something of this experience both in congregation and Presbytery. His own end came with great suddenness on the 12th of May, 1903, and was a profound shock to the congregation and to the community generally. He was buried in Lakeview Cemetery on Friday, 15th of May, 1903. The Rev. R. H. Warden, D.D., late Treasurer of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, conducted the services, assisted by the Rev. W. G. Jordan of Strathroy. The places of business in town were closed during the hour of the funeral.

On Friday evening, 11th of December, 1903, a tablet in honor of his memory was unveiled in St. Andrew's Church, when a touching and eloquent tribute to the dead pastor was delivered by the friend of his boyhood, Dr. A. MacLean, Sarnia.

The Rev. John Eadie of Point Edward was appointed Moderator of the vacant congregation. After a vacancy of almost one year the Rev. James S. Scott of St. Andrew's Church, Brantford, received a unanimous call, and was inducted on the 19th of February, 1904.
