ONTARIO AND ITS WATER POW

The Provincial Power Commission in process of formation, under the guidance of the Hon. Adam Beck, promises to create for Ontario the machinery for industrial development and advancement such as will serve to fasten upon it the eyes of the capitalistic and manufacturing world. Only one thing is needed to make this province one of the greatest of North America's industrial centres. That is cheap power. Nature has provided an abundance of it at Niagara, as well as along a dozen other streams between the Ottawa river and Sarnia Electrical inventions have forced the question of power development to the front, and as usual the private individual has sought to extract from a public utility wealth rightfully belonging to the people. late Government seemingly had no conception of the vaule of cheap power to the Province. It evaded its plain duty with respect to the conservation of the Niagara utility, and one by one friends were sent away from the Parliament Buildings with concessions worth millions; concessions carrying the right to sell to consumers power at a price four in a field assuring such a wealth of times its cost. Public Ownership production was never before placed in the hands of a government under such auspicious conditions. Yet the Ross Ministry, falling under the spell of wealthy men with a large political following, betrayed the people by disposing of franchises in secret, until it became evident that Ontario, by gradually parting with the instrument of manufacturing supremacy was discounting its industrial future in a manner to startle the country. The attitude of the Hon. Adam Beck on the Electrical Development Company's application for an additional concession - 125,-000 horse power - at the Falls, is pregnant with important results. The Commission, soon to be announced, will likely cover the whole question of Provincial water powers. It may even commit the Government to a policy of development

that the purpose of the Premier and the Hon. Adam Beck is not the ousting of the concessionaires from Niagara? Expropriation of the existing plants would be a bold stroke; but it would be a popular movement and command world-wide comment and approval. From that moment Ontario would loom up as an industrial workshop with almost unlimited capacity for expansions Every thriving municipality within reach of our electrical development stations would feel the inpetus that had ushered in a new era, with its abundance of cheap power and its opportunities for capital and labor.



Our Newest Senator.

Hon. Wm. Ross, of Halifax, has been called to the Senate. He has been over fifty years in public life, and is nearing his 80th birthday. As for the details of this long life, it may be said that Mr. Ross was born at Boularderle Island, Nova Scotta, December, 1825, the son of John Ross, who came from Sutherlandshire, Scotland, in 1816. He was educated at his birthplace, and as a young man was postmaster at Englishtown, the exact dates not being available. In 1859 he was elected for the County of Victoria, N. S., to a seat in the Nova Scotta Assembly, which he able. In 1859 he was elected for the County of Victoria, N. S., to a seat in the Nova Scotia Assembly, which he occupied till 1867. In the latter year he was returned for the same County as member for the House of Commons, and when Mr. Mackenzie came into power in 1873, he was made Minister of Militia. He was appointed Collector of Customs at Halfax in 1874 and resigned in 1888. Upon the return of Sir Wilfrid Laurier to power he declined the post of Inspector of Immigration. He unsuccessfully contested the seat in 1891. He did not offer himbelf as a candidate, but was returned in 1900. He falled to secure the nomination in 1904, when the redistribution merged the County into a differently-arranged constituency. He is a lieutenant-colonel in the Nova Scotia militia, and was for many years grand accretary of the Masonic Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia His views are set down as being Imperial Federationist. He is a temperance advocate and a Presbyterian.


