LARGE quantities of Ontario oats are being
received at St. John via the C. P. R.

THE shipments of coal in the Nanaimo and
Comox districts for September were 34,909
tons.

THE dry goods stock of Messrs. McSweeney
Bros., Moncton, has been sold to Mr. Sullivan,
formerly with McSweeney Bros.

A. LOAN by-law authorizing the mayor and
aldermen of Nanaimo to borrow \$12,000 was
negatived last week by a vote of 64 to 46.

THE annual meeting of the Maritime Ware-
housing and Dock Co. was held in St. John
last week. The former board of directors was
re-elected.

AT the vegetable canning factory of Hoegg,
Sheffield, New Brunswick, which closed last
week for the fall, 70,000 cans of Indian corn
have been put up during this season.

ONTARIO Letters Patent authorize the in-
crease of the Toronto Real Estate Investment
Company's capital stock from \$400,000 to
\$2,000,000.

THE Brockville, Westport, and Sault Ste.
Marie Railway is one of the newest enter-
prises of the railway sort in Eastern Ontario.
Ground will be surveyed, and possibly con-
struction work done this winter between
Westport and Sharbot Lake, 19 miles, to con-
nect with the C.P.R.

Mercantile Summary.

WINDSOR is going ahead, clearly. Her as-
sessment, which in 1888 was \$2,775,000, is
this year \$4,223,000, and her population has
increased about 1,000 over last year.

THERE are said to be fewer vacant houses in
Winnipeg at the present time than at any
period since 1882. It is estimated the popu-
lation has now reached 24,000.

THE population of Brantford this year is
14,726, as against 13,384 last year. The ag-
gregate value of property is \$5,464,230, in-
creased from \$5,172,630 a year ago.

DURING the past season, says the Yarmouth
Tribune, the blueberries sent to Boston by the
steamer "Yarmouth" amounted to 6,204
crates, or 99 tons, 528 lbs., valued at \$11,144.

THE imports at the port of Moncton in Sep-
tember amounted to \$102,348, the exports to
\$40,540, as compared with imports of \$136,144
and exports of \$29,109 in September of last
year.

A MAKER of fanning mills in Chatham,
Munson Campbell, has manufactured and sold
nearly 3,000 fanning mills this season, this
being the largest number ever made in one
year by this maker.

THE Chatham Manufacturing Company have
made and shipped during the present year
nearly 1,900 of their wagons to various parts

of the Dominion, including New Brunswick,
Nova Scotia, Manitoba, the North-West, and
British Columbia. The company have orders
now on hand which will bring the number to
over 2,000.

OYSTER shipment from Prince Edward
Island has been somewhat active of late. On
one day, a Saturday, the steamer from Sum-
merside took away 750 barrels; then on
Thursday about 1,000 barrels offered as
freight; and by the steamer "Miramichi"
over \$5,500 worth were shipped. The calm
weather has proved favorable for oyster-
raking.

THE exports from Saint John for September
last were valued at \$383,336, and all but \$78,000
worth were of Canadian production. In the
previous September the value was \$319,795,
and of this only \$199,000 worth was Canadian.
The increase of last month, was mainly in
wood goods, but partly also in animals and
manufactures. The shipment of lumber ex-
ceeded twenty and a half million feet; the pine
timber reached 7,200 tons, and the birch 610
tons; then there were spars, box shooks,
shingles, palings, etc. Among the other ex-
ports were red granite, salt, and oil. Imports
at St. John during the month showed a decrease,
viz., \$387,070, as compared with \$406,199 in
September, 1888. The free goods were in
greatest quantity last month, however.
