Resolved, That the foregoing Resolutions be sent to his Majesty's Council for their Concurrence, and that his Majesty's Council be requested to join with this

House in the Address to his Royal Highness.

Resolved, That a Committee be appointed, to join a Committee of his Majesty's Council for the purpose of preparing a suitable Address to his Royal Highness, and that the same, when agreed to by the House, be sent for approbation to his Ma-

jesty's Council:

Refolved, That the beforementioned Committee wait on his Excellency the Lieutenant Governor to present him with a Copy of the foregoing Resolutions, and humbly to beg, that his Excellency will be pleased at the head of both Branches of the Legislature to present to his Royal Highness, the humble Address of the Province of Nova-Scotia,

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the foregoing Resolutions to the Council, and

defire their Concurrence to the same.

On Motion the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to consider further of a Supply to be granted for the Support of his Majesty's Government.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, Mr. Skinner took the Chair, Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair,

The Chairman reported, that they had made further Progress in the Business to them referred, and prayed leave to sit again on the Consideration of the same, which the House agreed to.

A Message from the Council by Mr. Gautier,

Mr. Speaker,

The Council having read, and considered the several Resolutions of the House of Assembly, relative to the Grant of the Sum of sive Hundred Guineas, to be laid out in the Purchase of a Star for his Royal Highness Prince EDWARD, as a Testimony of Respect for his Royal Highness, and of the Sense which the Legislature entertains of the many essential Benefits, which the Province has derived from him, it was thereupon resolved, that the Council do unanimously concur with the House of Assembly, in their Resolutions, and that the Honorable Henry Newton, and Benning Wentworth, be a Committee to join a Committee of the House of Assembly, on the Occasion.

And then the Messenger withdrew.

Ordered, That Mr. Uniacke, Mr. Wallace, and Mr. Tonge, be a Committee to join the Committee of his Majesty's Council agreeable to the Resolution of this House this day communicated to the Council, and that the Clerk do acquaint the Council therewith.

Then the House adjourned till Seven of the Clock Post Meridian.

The House met agreeably to the Adjournment.
