Repeal of 2d and 5th Sections, 19 Vic.— Sections.

The Second and Fifth Sections, and so much of the Third also of parts of other Section of the said Act, passed in the Ninetcenth Year of the Reign of Her Majesty, entitled "An Act for Establishing the Legal Value of certain British and other Coins in this Colony," as limits the application of that Section to Gold Coins of the United States coined before the First day of March in the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty Two, are hereby Repealed; and the remaining provisions of the said Third Section shall be held to apply to the Gold Coins of the United States, of the denominations therein mentioned, coined after the First day of July, in the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty Four, being multiples or divisions of those mentioned in the First Section of this Act.

Value of Foreign Doubleon Coin.

The Foreign Gold Coin called the Doubloon, containing Three Hundred and Sixty Two Grains of pure Gold, instead of Three Hundred and Sixty Three Grains as mentioned in the Eighth Section of the said recited Act, shall pass and be a legal tender at and after the rate of Three Pounds Sixteen Shillings and Nine Pence currency.
