fifhery on the banks of Newfoundland, and the mouth of the river St. Laurence, I do not fee that the poffeffion of Quebec or Montreal relates to it, more than would the poffession of Constantinople; at these places they cure no fish, and they are infinitely at too great a diftance to be of any protection to the veffels employed in this bufiness; Gaspie therefore or any little place on either fide of the gulf, would . be more important in regard to this article. As from these reasons it appears that Canada in itfelf would be of no confequence, but rather an incumbrance to France, I must repeat that I think it idle to imagine that they would infift on the ceffion of it, or indeed accept it, unless they entertained views of removing us from the dominion of the lakes, and were confident
