

SENT OVERSEAS

No More Complete Infantry Battalions are to go From Canada

NEW SYSTEM

Of Raising Re-Inforcements for Front Being Worked Out

Ottawa, Feb. 10.-Provision has been made for the representation of various territorial divisions of Canada by battalions of groups of battalions in England at the front. Consideration is consequently being given here to plans to bring into conformity with this new arrangement overseas, the system of raising reinforcements in the Dominion and despatching them to England.

When the new system is worked out there will be units in each section in Canada producing reinforcements which will move on to that district's reserve battalion or battalions in England, and thence be transferred to the corresponding units in France. A number of mil-Itia units have already been authorized to raise reinforcements for overseas service and permanent units for the enrolment and training of recruits will probably be formed. No more complete infantry battalions will be sent abroad.

Drafts to be Sent Instead drafts, including a small percentage of lieutenants and headed perhaps by a "conducting officer" of higher rank, will go from Canada. The "conducting officer," if no employment at his own rank his available for him in Engiand, will have the option of reverting to a lower rank or returning to Canada.

It is announced that as most of the railway work at the front is done in the early summer no more rail-way construction battalions will be authorized for some time. Moreover enough forestry units to meet re quirements have been authorized provided they attain their strength Recent advices from England are to the effect that no more Canadian artillery or Army Service Corps offi-cers need be sent over for some time in view of the promotion of men who have had experience in the ranks.


