**DAVID DOWLEY.**

The General President of the Kitley Agricultural Society—Champion Ase—Owner of Eastern Ontario.

The above cut is a very fair representation of one of Frankville's most noted citizens. Born within a mile of the village of Frankville, in the township of Kitley, Leeds Co., he has had such a love for home associations that he never found a section that had a more prominent citizen to entice him to leave the home of his fathers and settle away from the camp fire of his native village. When yet a young man he entered into partnership with S. J. Southworth in handling the famous Ansonia clocks, and many judicious stories are told of his trips and experiences while selling clocks and jewelry in the townships on the upper Ottawa. Mr. Dowley is very well "fixed" financially, as he owns a large number of good properties in Frankville and Brockville, and no new enterprise is projected in his native village but has his hearty support, both orally and financially. In politics David is a strong Conservative and the acknowledged leader of the "Kitley Blues" in matters political, but he always conducts an honorable warfare, and when the din of battle is over and the smoke of the conflict clears away, he is ever ready to bury the hatchet and treat all his most bitter political opponents with the same off-hand geniality as of yore. For many years Mr. Dowley has been the popular auctioneer of the surrounding country, and no man has ever wielded the hammer in the counties of Leeds and Grenville who was more popular with both seller and buyer. For the past five years the Reporter has had a monopoly of the bills for the auction sales conducted by the general David, and it is no uncommon thing to have from six to eight sale notices in one issue of the paper. For ten years in succession he has been unanimously elected as president of the Kitley Township Agricultural Society, and the success attained by that, the most popular township fair in Eastern Ontario, is largely due to his ability as a manager.
