### FIVE MEN IN A RUNAWAY

Every One Injured and Bones Snapped Like Kindling Wood.

sam Callided With Telephone Post and Finally Murled Rig Through Plate Glass Window-Horses Shied On En. countering a Street Car-In the Mix-Up No Fewer Than Six Legs Were Broken... Names of Injured.

Brantford, Nov. 2.—The most re-markable and disastrous runaway in the recent history of Brantford octhe recent history of Brantford oc-curred shortly before 10 o'clock Mon-day night. Five men had driven to Burford in a two-seated covered rig, drawn by a team of horses, and were returning via Paris road, when the accident happened. Near the car barns on Brant avenue a street car was encountered. The horses shied and broke into a run. The rig collid-ed with a telephone post on the side ed with a telephone post on the side of the road, was overturned and the

occupants thrown into the street.

There were five men in the outfit and all were injured. In the mix-up six legs were broken and other wounds inflicted. All were caught between the rig and the post and bones snapped like kindling wood. The injured are: John Syrett. 62 Dundas street, one

leg broken, one rib fractured.
William Coleman, 177 Darling
street, one leg broken.
George Walters, 99 Pearl, two legs

broken. Charles Mahler, 97 West Mill street, two legs broken.
William McMeans, 261 Clarence

street, bruised knee. All the men are moulders in the employ of the Buck Company. The ambulance was called out, the men were picked up on Brant avenue, near James street, and were removed to the hospital, where their injuries were attended to.

The team of horses dashed down

Brant avenue, turned east along Col-borne and finally hurled the rig through Ald. Corey's plate glass window at his grocery store, corner of Colborne and Murray streets. The top of the rig was demolished, one wheel was smashed and the harness slightly damaged. The horses escaped unhurt. The men were doing well at the hospital yesterday.
