New Brunswick May Vote On Union Under Federal Act

It is not necessary to quote the Attorney General's authority for the above. The Federal Act provides for that. Under the Federal Act provision is made that, on presenting a signed requisition to the Session, the Session must arrange for the taking of a vote by ballot, and that the voting shall continue for two weeks. Every man or woman well informed on this question knows that. But in New Brunswick, the vote already being taken under the Provincial Act, it is not necessary to take it under the Federal Act; but it always must be taken though seemingly of no value.

Cardinal Begin Died Sunday

His Eminence Cardinal Louis Nazaire Begin, Archbishop of Quebec and primate of the Roman Catholic Church in Canada, died early Sunday morning in the Archbishop's Palace of uremia, with which disease he was stricken last Sunday night. He was 85 in January last.
