LOCAL & OTHER ITEMS

The horse show opened in the agricultural building here yesterday and was largely attended. The show of horses was very fine. It will close today.

An extra session of the United States Congress is called to meet at Washington on April 7th.

The Earl Grey came to Charlottetown yesterday and is expected to fly between here and Pictou until further notice. The Minto continues on the Georgetown-Pictou route.

Thirty three persons were killed in a storm that swept over several of the Southern States on Friday last.

London has something new in the way of litigation. A well known man who lives in the north end of the city is suing a railway man for the sum of \$50 as a fee for performing the wedding of the young man in October last.

Fernie B. C. and the surrounding country is in the grip of the worst storm known here for years. During the storm four hours heavy snow accompanied by gales from northwest, has made the streets impassable. There will be great danger from snowslides along the line of the C. P. R. in the mountains especially if the temperature rises.

I is announced that all employees of the mechanical departments of the I. C. R. & P. E. I. R. system will in future work under a new schedule, in effect Feb. 1st. The basis of settlement is a nine hour day, as well as a substantial increase in wages.

The entertainment in the Opera House here, on St. Patrick's night was a quite successful and there was a good attendance. The dramatic portion of the performance was much enjoyed and the vocal and instrumental contributions were of a high order. Entertainments were, also held at Emerald and other places throughout the Province.

The Central Seed Fair conducted in this city during Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday of last week was quite successful. On Wednesday evening a great public meeting was held in the Prince of Wales College Hall. Addresses were delivered by the President Rev. Father McKeenan, Premier Matheson Hon. Mr. McKinnon, American Consul East, Rev. Dr. Gardner, Dr. J. C. McDonald, Mrs. Dunbrack and others. A complimentary address accompanied the gift of a beautiful Morris chair was presented to the President, Rev. P. D. McKeenan, in appreciation of his eminent services to the association. On Thursday forenoon the judges, in the various classes, gave their reasons for the awards and the fair came to a close. The seeds exhibited are reported to be much superior in quality to those of last year.

The pro Cathedral as the church purchased by the Catholics of St. Dunstan's parish will now be known, has been undergoing preparation for divine service for some days, and will be used for the first time this evening when the office of Tenebrae will be sung therein. Tenebrae will be continued, as usual, tomorrow and Friday evenings. Mass will be celebrated tomorrow (Holy Thursday), Good Friday and Holy Saturday. The Way of the Cross will be solemnly performed at 3 and 5 o'clock Good Friday afternoon. Masses will be celebrated in the pro Cathedral on Easter Sunday at 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 o'clock.

King Assassinated. King George of Greece was assassinated yesterday afternoon while walking in the streets of Saloniki. The assassin was a Greek of low mental type. He gave the name of Aleko Schines. He shot the king through the heart. The king was accompanied only by his aide-le-camp, Lt. Col. Francouis. The assassin came suddenly at him and fired one shot out of a five chamber revolver. The tragedy caused intense excitement. The assassin was at once seized and overpowered, the wounded king lifted into a carriage and taken at once to Papafio Hospital. He was still breathing but died in half an hour.

Prince Nicholas, the King's third son and other officers rushed to the hospital. Arriving first Prince Nicholas summoned the officers and speaking in a voice choked with sobs said: "It is my deep regret to announce to you the death of your beloved King and I invite you to swear fidelity to the new Sovereign King Constantine."

The assassin of the King is an evil looking man of forty years of age. At first he refused to explain his motive for the crime. He declared his name was Aleko Schines and in reply to an officer who asked him if he had any pity for his country said he was opposed to all governments. He maintained a perfectly impassive demeanor, which suggests he is irresponsible for his action. Notwithstanding the rapidity with which the King received attention he was found to be dead when he reached the hospital. Precautions were at once taken throughout the city and perfect order is being maintained. King George was a brother of Queen Mother Alexandra of England and uncle of King George V.

in the Canadian parliament the speaker was forced to name a member whose persistent disregard of the rules of the house made this course necessary. The member named was Dr. Michael Clark of Red Deer who, since entering the politics of the Dominion, has more than once posed before the house as an adherent and exponent of British parliamentary procedure. The opposition revolved against the house rules as soon as these rules were applied late Friday night and continued the fight all night and all day, dividing the house eight times on questions of order and finally adopting a position of open defiance of the speaker.

One of the children, a little girl, was in a critical condition at the time of his death, suffering from a bad cold. His funeral took place to the parish church at St. Peter's on Tuesday, 11th, and was very largely attended. A Requiem Mass was celebrated and the funeral service was performed by the pastor, Rev. A. McAlinay. May his soul rest in peace.


