IN CONNECTION WITH THE INTER-CHURCH FORWARD MOVEMENT.

The week beginning April 12, will be a great occasion, in fact the greatest, in the history of the Methodist Church in Newfoundland. It is the climax to the great Spiritual Campaign that has been in progress for almost a year, when the people will be given the opportunity to apply the "Acid Test" of money to their prayers for the coming of the Kingdom of Christ on earth. Most encouraging reports have been received from some of the most isolated and extensive missions in the Conference, regarding the Campaign, in its influence on the quickened life of the Church. Wherever the Programme of the M.N.C. has been faithfully approximated, Pastor and people have found it of immense value to the real life of the Church. One of the Young Ministers, on a remote Northern mission in his report says: "I do not know how much we can do for the National Campaign, but I know that it is going to do a great deal for us." Another young minister, whose mission consists of several islands says: "I got the people together, and explained as well as I could the meaning of the National Campaign. I asked them what are you going to do about it? Will you be intercessors? The following Sunday you could notice a difference in their prayers and since that time the church seems to have taken on new life. At most of the appointments new members have been added to the church."

The Methodist Churches of the city have decided to conduct a United Campaign to reach the financial objection. Next week will see 300 men and women representative of city Methodism, eagerly, and even hilariously engaged in securing for the "Thank Offering," an amount that shall be creditable to and in keeping with the well-known liberality of the Methodist people.

By advices received to-day, the Rev. J. H. Arnup, B.A., the General Organizer of the M.N.C., and Rev. Peter Bryce, General Secretary of the Financial Campaign, are "on their way to St. John's, and expect to arrive on Sunday by the S. S. Sachem." The Newfoundland Campaign is of special interest from the fact that it is the last in the group of 12 Conferences to complete its work. The total amount reached by the Conferences in Canada to March 29, is \$4,714,679, or \$714,679, more than the object. Surely this is a challenge and an incentive to Newfoundland methodism.—M.F.

 S.S. Eagle finished discharging yesterday afternoon, her turn out being as follows: 6,336 young harps, 17 bedlamers, 5 old harps and 5 old hoods, total 6,351 seals, weighing 139 tons, 19 cwt., 2 qrs., 26 lbs. gross; 129 tons, 13 cwt., 8 lbs. nett; gross value \$28,045.65; nett value, \$28,019.65. Her crew of 202 men shared \$46.00 each. The young harps averaged 46 1/4 lbs.

NEPTUNE.
 The Neptune finished discharging yesterday, her turn out being: 7,261 young harps, 6 young hoods, 7 bedlamers, 8 old harps and 7 old hoods, a total of 7,289 seals, weighing 151 tons, 8 cwt., 1 qr., 5 lbs. gross and 146 tons, 8 cwt., 1 qr., 21 lbs. nett. The gross value of the cargo was \$32,155.79, and nett value \$32,055.79. The crew of 205 men shared \$51.87 each. The average weight of the young harps was 46 5/16 lbs.

Channel.
 A report from Channel to the Board of Trade states the total catch of cod-fish between that point and Grand Bay is 4,294 qts. to date. Prospects are very poor at present, but sufficient bait is obtainable. All were hoping that when the ice embargo was lifted there would be a change for the better, but it seems the fish has passed on down the Straits and no improvement occurred.

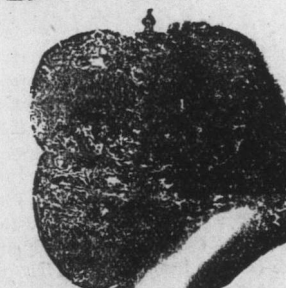
