Wreck of S. S. Norfjeld.

CAPTAIN'S STORY OF LOSS.

An investigation into the wreck of the Norwegian steamer Norfjeld, which ran ashore in Flower's Cove, Nfld., during a snow storm, was held at Sydney on Dec. 8th, by Mr. J. A. Young, Norwegian Consul. The captain and a number of the officers of the crew made statements regarding the wreck. Obscure visibility and lack of any positive indication as to the ship's position was given as the reason for the loss of the steamer. The captain and members of the crew tell an interesting story of their experience with the natives along the coast on which they were wrecked. The captain and a number of his hands went ashore and during their absence a large number of the inhabitants, regardless of the predictions of the remaining members of the crew, took charge of the ship, stripped her of everything that was movable and left her bare. —North Sydney Herald.

Successful Nfld. Student.

Mr. Wilson Powell, of Bonavista, has just been elected President of Queen's University, Kingston, Ont., Alma Mater Society. The College Journal says:—
