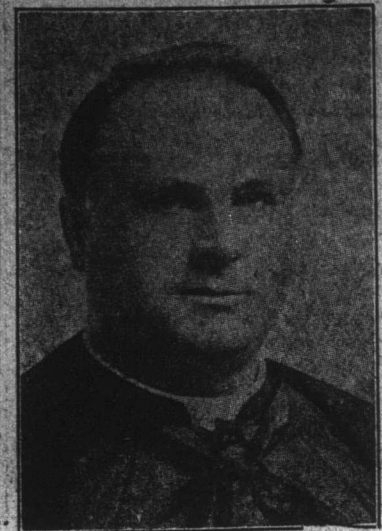

TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.**AMERICAN WORLD FLIGHT AVIATORS NOW RESTING.**

TOKIO, May 22.—The three globe encircling American airplanes arrived this evening at Kasumigaura, fifty miles from here, making the 720 mile jump from Hilo-kappa Bay in twelve hours and fifty minutes, stopping at Minato two hours for lunch. They will stay there a week resting and overhauling the planes. They will then jump off for Kaiti-mipo, 50 miles south to the extremity of the island.

NFLD. SKIPPER REFUTES STATEMENT.

HALIFAX, N.S., May 22.—Captain Bullen of the schooner Gladys Bullen of St. John's, Nfld., said to-day that his fog horn was working properly and all precautions were being observed when he was struck in a fog off this harbour on Monday by the car ferry Prince Edward Island. This is in refutation of the charge of Captain Reid of the car ferry to the effect that the Bullen was not sounding the proper signals when the two craft collided in a fog.
