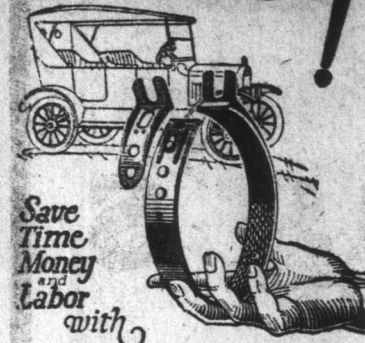

Bartlett Advises Base on Alaskan Coast for Flight

HALIFAX, N.S., Nov. 2.—(C. P.)—Aircraft can be successfully utilized in polar exploration, providing the flights are attempted from a large base in Alaska, according to Captain Bob Bartlett, veteran Arctic navigator, who was one of the late Commander Peary's party when he made his historic dash to the North Pole in 1909.

Captain Bartlett was in Halifax yesterday for a few hours en route to Washington, D.C., where he is now attached to the Navy Department. He had with him hundreds of valuable specimens which he collected last summer off the Labrador Coast, specimens which he will present to the Smithsonian Institute, to be used in that organization in its research work relative to the fishing industry in the North Atlantic.

"It is useless to attempt to fly across the vast Arctic regions adjacent to the Pole, with only a few months' preparation and with small planes," said Captain Bartlett. "And personally I don't believe it is wise or reasonable to expend large sums for expeditions of this nature that hope to make the flight from such places as Etah. There is one place where these flights can be started, and that is off the Alaskan coast and in the Polar Basin."

No Electrical Storms.
According to Captain Bartlett conditions in the Polar Basin are ideal for the use of aircraft. "There are no electrical storms there, no great change of temperature, no dangerous air currents and there is continuous daylight during the summer season. But these conditions are not so favorable if you plan the flight from the North Atlantic."

Captain Bartlett explained that he had been in the Alaskan waters for the American Government two years ago and during the 49 days he was off Behring Straits made observations every day, gathering an immense amount of data which is still available for any explorer who desires to make a flight to the Pole, or to explore the vast Arctic stretches.

"I am not so keen on flying to the North Pole," remarked Captain Bartlett. "Peary discovered the Pole in 1909 and it is someone else who wants to go there again, or be the first to make the trip by airplane, we'll let him do so. But the proper object of any Arctic expedition should be to explore the lands that are beyond the Arctic Circle in the hope of securing some valuable information for the scientific world. It is useless to attempt flights from such a base at Etah, and hope to be successful. But the flights can be made from Alaska."

Facilities At Home.
He explained that facilities are available at Nome to build large aircrafts. The machine or machines could be constructed there and the expedition provided with a mother ship, which would follow the tow of the ice-fields northward.

"The best ship for this purpose is the old reeler Bear, now in the United States coastguard service," said Capt. Bartlett. "If the trip is started early in June the planes can make their flights from the placid waters of the Polar Basin and have several weeks to continue observation."

Captain Bartlett pointed out that flights planned from the base in the North Atlantic cannot be attempted before August and the time is far too short to make any extensive observations. It was the short season that really made it impossible for Donald B. MacMillan to meet with any great success in his recent expedition to the North, according to Captain Bartlett.

He says he is ready to go into the Arctic again next year providing he can secure sufficient financial backing to outfit an expedition that will have a base on the Alaskan coast.

Worth £100,000

SEVEN-TON STONE THAT FELL FROM NOWHERE.

Carrying in her hold a rare meteoric stone, which "fell from nowhere" weighs about seven tons, and is valued at £100,000, the Danish schooner Sokongen is lying at Aberdeen. The stone, which was discovered by the king, was taken on board the ship at North Star Bay, Greenland. It was first found in 1918 on the edge of the rock 400ft. high and sixteen miles inland.

Owing to the transport difficulties and lack of appliances it lay for some time where it was first found. Two years ago an endeavour was made to remove it to the coast, where it was recently arrived. It was placed on a frequently broke the ice. Although the dogs were used to convey it the stone was only got to the coast with the greatest difficulty.

Captain P. M. Pedersen, of the schooner, says it is valued at £100,000 and there are only two others in the world bigger—one in America and one in Great Britain. The new stone is being taken to the mineralogical museum at Copenhagen.

On leaving North Star Bay, the Sokongen met with misfortune. Two of the crew were drowned while trying to take a hawser to land during a severe storm. The meteoric stone affected the compass, and difficulty was experienced in steering a course for Aberdeen.



Apes' Brains

"We must credit apes and monkeys with a restless alert brain, with experimental eagerness, with long memories in some cases, with a capacity for apprehending relations so that they could argue from what they had done in one case to what they should do in a somewhat similar case. In short some of them attain to a high degree of intelligence."

This is the conclusion of Professor J. Arthur Thomson in Part 1 of "The New Natural History—Nature's Wonderland" (George Newnes, Ltd., 1s. 3d. net), which is to be completed in about twenty fortnightly issues.

The author, in discussing the question, "Have apes and monkeys reason?" says we must credit them with "perceptual inference"; that is, they say, they have a little experimental game in their minds, the counters in the game being memory images of pictures of things.

There are to be over 2,000 illustrations, many in colour, others in black and white, of animals, birds, fishes and reptiles.
