

In this latter respect both Canadian and American tools are so much superior to English that these have been nearly driven out of this market. A Sheffield steel manufacturer, after walking through one of our manufactories, expressed his astonishmeni in the following terms: "Why you manufacture the scythe with a trip hammer, and finish it equal to a razor, while we still go on in the anti-tiquated method of manufacturing by hand, producing a less perfect article, not nearly so well made or finished."
