These gentlemen have compelled all sorts of American consumers, from those who build ships to those who make ploughs, to spend more by from £2 to £2 10s. Sterlieg per ton for all the iron they have used than they would have had to pay but for the import duty on British iron; and this excessive profit having been made at the exost of the national marine, we can well understand how convenient it is to exaggerate the "consequential damages" of the Alabama. To suppose that we are responsible for the present state of the American shipbuilding trade, or that it is in the smallest measure or the remotest degree in fault if the American mercantile navy is not at this moment far larger than it ever was, is one of the grossest delusions ever palmed upon an infelligent people. If fhe Americans, are only building 50,000 tons of shipping a year instead of 500,000, it is evelusively their own fault, the natural and foreseen result of the tariff which they chose to set up just at the outbreak of the civil war, the Presidential assent to it having been one of the last official acts of MrBuchanan. If they want compensation for the decay of their mercantile marine; if they want to be indemnified for the disappearace of their flag from the inghways of the ocean, they must levy a tax upon all who have gained by the Morrillariff, the true source of their national losses."


