GAS WIPES OUT ENTIRE FAMILY

Enters by Sewer Pipe and Kills Parents and Children While They Sleep.

Burlington, Vt., Jan. 6.—Through some unknown manner, but probably by way of a sewer pipe, illuminating gas entered the house of George H. Devino, a grocery clerk, at Winoski, some time tonight, and asphyxiated the entire family of six persons, consisting of the father, mother and four children.

All were dead when Devino's brother broke into the house today, but it is thought that Devino was aroused by the escaping gas and was attempting to escape when he was overcome. His body was found on the floor beside the bed with his mouth stuffed with cotton batting.

The children were Isabella, 5 years; Adelaide, 3 years; Vonneg, 2 years, and Cecilia, 5 months.

The Devino house is not connected with the gas main, but the odor was very noticeable about the closets and sink drains. It is believed that the gas came from a break in the main and entered the house through the regular sewer connection.

WALL KILLS FIREMEN
Three Meet Death While Fighting Big New York Conflagration.

New York, Jan. 6.—Three firemen were killed during a fire that burned out the interior of Hill's paper warehouse in Roosevelt street tonight. Before the third floor of the five-story structure fell all the men were ordered out of the building. Firemen Campbell, Siefert and Lennon, who had been working within the walls, failed to respond, and a subsequent roll call established that they are beyond doubt buried in the ruins. The monetary loss was about \$15,000.
