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PASS LEGISLATION TO FOIL SUFFRAGETTES

Hunger Strikes Will Be of Little Use if These Bills Go Through.

London, March 5.—It is understood that the Government has decided to introduce two bills in Parliament at as early a date as possible, dealing with the suffragette difficulty.

The first will empower the Home Secretary to exercise the same licensing control over persons committed to prison as he now does over convicts.

Thus a suffragette person adopting the hunger strike would be sent to a hospital or a home until her health had been restored and would then be recommitted to prison.

This method would be repeated until the prisoner had served the full term, in which the time out on license would not be counted.

The second bill will provide a better procedure for recovering fines and damages from suffragettes convicted of offences on property, and will otherwise modify the criminal law in the desired direction.

CORRESPONDENCE

As to Electric Railways.

Some days ago I noted an article in your paper re electric and steam road operation on the lines running out of Detroit and operated by the Detroit United Railroad. The greater part of my electric railroad experience was with the above company, my duties taking me daily on the two lines under discussion.

I therefore feel I cannot let the assertions made by your informant pass without comment. We will take the article in the order in which it appears.

While it is quite true that the M. C. R. opposes any arrangement whereby the electric line should handle their cars, the electric company operates a standard steam engine and hauls cars over their line between Oxford and Ortonville, a distance of 13 miles.

Carload loads of coal, lumber, sawlogs, etc., are handled on this line, and it is the cost of handling this freight, which is transferred at Oxford to the M. C. R. the shippers are trying to overcome.

Referring to the steam road operated in conjunction with the electric road, the number of miles covered by this steam service, instead of being four, is 24, or about one and one-third times the length of the London and Port Stanley line.

As in the case of the Flint division, there is maintained a complete equipment of switching engine, box and flat cars, round house, water tanks, etc.

From two cars are handled nightly, including the entire output of several of the salt plants located along the line. The above service is in addition to several electric express cars, which handle the passenger business exclusively.

The important point to be noted is that this service is given on standard electric railroads, with ordinary 500-volt direct current constant, with trolley wires only 18 feet 6 inches from rail, whereas the London and Port Stanley overhead equipment would doubtless be of the catenary construction, and 22 feet from rail. Toronto, March 5.—The annual report of the Inspector of mines for Ontario gives the records of 246 accidents, of which 188 were below and 62 above ground, resulting in the death of 32 men and injuries to 216. At metallurgical works there were 128 accidents, with 10 killed and 122 injured.
